 it goes to the Buyer with the rest of the land; To my son
 David I order five pounds, To my son Thomas seven & a half
 To my Daughter Margaret Thompson twenty shillings & what
 remains to be equally divided among my children & grand-
 children now to be named, William M'Donell my son & my son
 James M'Donell & my daughter Jane Robinson & my grand-
 daughter Margaret Thompson - And I do recommend & desire the
 former Wills & Testaments, and acknowledge this & none but
 this to be my last Will & Testament, In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand & seal this 10th day of October in the Year of
 our Lord 1790.

 & Legacies, Bequests & Executors by me in anywise before this time
