in a sound state of health with respect to my body yet of
perfect soundness of mind, I do hereby certify, calling
to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is ap-
pointed for all men to die, I do make & declare this
my last will & Testament. That is to say principally &
first of all I give & bequeath my soul to God that gave it
& my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent
Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors & ask
nothing thereof but at the general Resurrection I shall
rise in the same again by the mighty power of God & as
touching such worldly Estate wherewith God has been pleased
to bless me in this life, I give & dispose of in the following
way & manner herefirst I will that all my lawful Debts be
paid; That my wife shall have her maintenance on the land
& the use of the House as long as she remains a Widow, together
with the Cattle Hogs & sheep & she shall retain her part of the
household furniture till death & likewise among her children
as may suit best, Moreover I will that my land whereon I live
be divided between my two sons James & John Robison &
the two Girls viz Sarah & Mary Robison. I do also bequeath
to my eldest daughter Sarah my Negro woman Jane to be her
property & also one Cow & a saddle & two cows & calves
& to my Daughter Mary I bequeath my Negro boy Ned
together with a horse & saddle & two cows & calves.

a sound & disposing mind & knowing that it is appointed for
all to die; have thought proper to make this my last will
& Testament as follows. In the first place I bequeath my
soul unto God who gave it & my body to the earth to be
in a Christian manner. I leave to my beloved
brother William Reed all my claims to land in the
western country left me by my father's will, which land
was not yet divided, nor settled in any way among
the legal heirs & also one half of the price of my negro boy
George whom I allow to be sold & money built to my
brother William a note of one hundred dollars due
