Be it known to all whom it may concern that I divide
my plantation into three parts. To my son John I divide
that part of my lands lying on the west side of the hollow
below his fields crossing the creek a little above the back ford to
Joseph Everett's line. The other two divisions lying on the north
and south side of Clark's creek running by my Spring. That
creek to be the dividing line ~~between~~ ^{of} the parts. ~~Let~~ ^{it} my son to
have choice of the last division the other to be equally
divided in selection between my daughter Elizabeth
& my grandson Thomas Green Bennett. To Elizabeth &
hers should she have any I allow the half of the preceding
part. The Smith Tools and wagon I wish to be a
common stock for the use of all the members of my
family all at the same time contributing their proper
tenth part of labor or expense to repairing them when
necessary, or perfect their right to the use of one or both
My wife Jane I allow to hold my Mansion house
during her life and then to have the disposal of the
the Household furniture
