

In the presence of John Price Esq. day of April 1812 I do make & publish of the County of Mecklenburg State of N. Carolina, being very sick & weak in body but of sound mind & memory thank God for the same, and calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do now make & declare this my last will & testament, and for myself & my part of all I give & recommend my soul unto the hands of God who will my body to be buried in a Christian like manner & receive it the divine judgment of my creatures; and so troubling seek worthily State wherein with it better please God to dispose me in this life, I give & dispose of the same in the manner & form following viz - In the first place I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Dinate my negro woman named Charity my blanket, mare saddle & bridle my riding chair & harness mounted & furnished, my cupboard & one half of my cupboard & kitchen utensils, two steers, one of my stock of three milch cows before young ones, my sheep & half my hogs, together with an convenient & comfortable maintenance of the land I now have or own the house I now live in which does containnes any beddies, & also the use of all my tables chairs & book cases. I give & bequeath to my son William all my land west of Price line. In chiding my dwelling house & all my other buildings my Moshin colt saddle & bridle, my side or watch, & bed & furniture. It is my will that he be carried thro' a regular course of learning. One half of my body after I give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary my negro girl named Tilla & if she has any offspring to be divided amongst all my daughters, one bed & furniture one fourth part of my cupboard & kitchen utensils & saddle & bridle; I give & bequeath to my Daughter Abby also my negro fellow named Harry, a bed & furniture & saddle & bridle. Four fourth part of my cupboard & kitchen utensils -

I give & bequeath to my son David Clinton my tract of Land formerly the property of John Price Esq. my bed & colt, a saddle & bridle, when he arrives at the age of twenty four years, bed & furniture there hundred dollars which shall be paid to Interest till her coming to the age of twenty one years, one half of my body cloathing - And if it should please God that my wife should be delivered of the child she is now pregnant with & a living child I give & bequeath to said child my negro fellow named Red which shall be s. Esq. Price, but to Interest where ever, a bed & furniture a saddle & bridle -

do, Do as when I am dead, then my last will & Testament, be it present & proved  
first of all. I give & recommend my soul unto the keeping of God who, and  
my body to be buried in a Christian like Helmet to cover up the same  
as taught my ancestors, also as touching such worldly Goods wherewith  
it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give & dispose of the same  
in the manner & form following viz - In the first place I give & bequeath  
to my well beloved wife Dinah my negro woman named Charity my  
Saddles, mrs saddle & bridle my riding chain & harness covered &  
uncovered, my cupboard & half of my Cupboard & Kitchen Utensils  
I mean the one end of my Stock of three Milch cows & three young ones, my  
Sheaf & half my Hogs, together with an convenient & comfortable Maintenance  
over off the land I now have or have the house I now live in which do  
contains my widow, & also the use of all my Tables Chairs & book cases  
I give & bequeath to my son William all my land west of Price line. In  
clearing my dwelling house & all my other buildings my Master call  
Saddle & bridle, my Silver Hatch, & bed & furniture, It is my will that he  
be carried thro' a regular course of learning, One half of my body clothe  
, I give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary my negro girl named Tilla  
If she has any offspring to be divided amongst all my daughters, da  
ughters & furniture one fourth part of my cupboard & kitchen utensils  
& Saddle & bridle; I give & bequeath to my Daughter Abby also  
my negro, fellow named Harry, a bed & furniture, & saddle & bridle  
Four fourth part of my cupboard & kitchen utensils -

I give & bequeath to my son David Whilton my Tract of Land, formerly  
the property of John Price Dec'd my saddle cloth, a saddle & bridle, when  
he arrives at the age of eighteen years, his bed & furniture there hundred  
dollars which shall be paid to Interest till her comes to the age of  
Twenty one Years, one half of my body cloathing - And if it should  
please God that my wife should be delivered of the child she is  
now pregnant with & a living child I give & bequeath to said child  
my negro, fellow named Red, which shall be sold to Mr. Price, but  
to Interest when due, he bed & furniture a Saddle & Bridle -

I give & bequeath to my Nephew David Hartshorn of Joseph Hartshorn,  
my Hornmans land, I will that my negro Abram Harry and  
Tilla be kept on my land, for the purpose of Oeconomy my family

and I do declare [www.northcarolinapioneers.com](http://www.northcarolinapioneers.com) that my Beding the Horse & right hand man  
together with those creatures above bequeathed my to a good place from  
place, my Horse, the Dog, four hens, two H'rocks, one dressing knife  
in my hand same & cutting box & knife, rest of my family break up in  
the same Manner as said. It is my will that when my present bedding after  
my death be sold be divided, in the proportion of discharging the  
expenses of my Son Williams Education, which when so divided he  
shall be sold & divided equally among all my children & wife  
excepted! The remainder of my property to be sold & when my debts  
are discharged, The Balance to be divided as above mentioned excepting  
my Books which shall be equally divided between my wife & all  
my children, — I do hereby constitute & appoint my trusty  
friends James Harrell & Samuel McLean Executors of this my last  
will & Testament, and I do hereby appoint my trusty friends George  
Swain Joseph Harrell & Stephen McRae guardians for all my  
children & bind I do hereby now & before all other persons  
willing, Legacies or Bequests by me before this time named, & stippling  
& confirming this 1<sup>st</sup> of June to be my last will & Testament, in witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day and year  
first above written.
