Then I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Thomas when he
 arrives at the age of twenty one the one half of the plantation on which
 I now live. Then I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son John when
 he arrives at the age of twenty one years the remaining half of this
 plantation on which I now live. These I have given & reason to believe
 that my beloved wife Elizabeth is now pregnant with the child & if it
 should please God to preserve it till it arrives to the age of twenty one
 years if a son I will that my two sons Thomas & John pay unto
 him the third part of what he is worth in the above said plantation my
 value to be by the different men & women for that purpose when my
 son Thomas enters on his part but if a daughter I will that when
 she arrives at the age of sixteen years that they pay unto her six-
 pence less than the third part of said value. If it so hap-
pen that God to remove by death any of my said children before they
 arrive at full age, that it is my will the survivors or survivors
 enjoy their part as if a daughter the proportional part as above
 And lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint my Honoured & well beloved
 wife Elizabeth & my beloved wife Elizabeth to be my whole & sole executrix of this my
 last will & Testament, hereby revoking all other wills, Ratifying & confirming
 this as my last will & Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand & affixed my seal this first day of October in the year of our Lord 1776
 Signed, Sealed, & Published pronounced & attested by the said
 James O'Guerin as his last will & Testament in presence of us

In the name of God Amen, I David W. Michan of the County
 of Province of Carolina, being weak in body but of sound mind & memory
 do hereby make & declare this my last will & Testament
 and all others now before being, this annulled & first of all I recommend
 my soul to Almighty God who gave it & want my body to the earth
 to be buried in Christian burial according to the

direction of my executor. I give to my well beloved son
 James & his wife five shillings sterling to be raised out of my estate
 then due to my daughter Mary I give two cows & calves. Then to my
 son Charles I give one hundred acres of land joining the same side
 of my place & the Indian line & also a couple of the middle cows
 then due to my son David I give one hundred acres of land in the
 upper corner joining Samuel Abramson then due to my son
 Andrew I leave one hundred acres of land joining Charles above
 them & to my son & daughter I give one hundred acres of land joining
 David then due to my son Benjamin I give & bequeath one hundred
 acres of land including the clear land & all the improvements
 lastly the remaining one hundred & forty acres of land I order to be
 & equally divided among all my children except James & the
 remaining part of my goods & chattels likewise to be sold & divided
 as aforesaid; And also I do further declare that my children
 especially the younger who have not yet been & who shall be
 now learning out of the money that will fall to their parts
 And finally I do declare & appoint Hugh Thomas & Robert Lewis
 my sole & true Executors of this my last will & testament.

I give sealed & pronounced to be my last will & testament.

In presence of— And I bequeath to my daughter Mary
 her portion of— And I bequeath to my son Charles his not
 her portion expressly named I order to have an equal division of
 what shall remain from the sale of my goods & chattels I give a couple
 of cows with which they think fit to choose out of my whole stock.
