natural life, & her executors to become the property of William, the
Junior of this family. Item all the remainder of my moveable pro-
perty after my debts are paid to be at the sole disposal of my two
Eliz. — Item I do appoint my wife Deborah & Eliz. and
William their son Executrix of this my last will & testament
Lastly I do declare this to be my last will & testament made this
23rd day of March 1793 witness my hand & seal in presence
of William Harrison, Robert Marshall, Seals

disposing mind & memory blessed be God & calling to mind the mortality of
the body & that it is appointed for all men once to die, to constitute &
execute this my last will & testament in the manner & form following viz
first of all I command my soul to God who gave it, & my body to the
earth to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the disposal
of my executors herein after mentioned, in as full & clear a way
estate & person with it he shall come to God to judge me in this life I give
dispossession of the same as follows — First I will that my just debts and
funeral charge be discharged as soon as convenient after my decease
Item I give & bequeath unto my wife Deborah wife & myself the one half
profit of the plantation between I now live together with the said
Eliz. Maria & next houses & living her life together with all my house
furniture & possessions, & then the other half remaineth

134 The said branch to be at the disposal of my said wife to be left to either
of my three youngest children as they shall think fit but to no other. I
thereby leave unto my said wife Agnes all my cattle except one
horse named Blue which I leave to my daughter Elizabeth. I further
leave unto my said wife my two horses, all to be with her to be held
during her life. Then I give unto my son Joseph & to the said
land containing 200 acres to him or his wife at their marriage
as an undivided right, them their horses & apparel & furniture and
liberum such horses & cars here as has already been nominated
or there more. His liberum my horse that is blue. The above named
wife & son shall bring any child or children during the life of
my said wife that their such child or children shall be equally
divided among my three youngest children before mentioned
and that at their mothers decease, I further leave unto my daughter
Joseph a barrel more both of one year old. Likewise I leave unto
my two grandsons William & David Brown sons to my daughter
Margaret both cattle as has been nominated as this is already
I further give unto my sons Andrew, David & James & my
daughter Hannah. The negroes Brown & Elizabeth wife to
Johnson. It is wished by each of them the sum of five shillings
to be paid to each of them twelve months after my decease if
I demand it. And Lastly, I do nominate & appoint my said
beloved wife Agnes Executive of my son Joseph in case of my
last will & Testament, hereby revoking other wills by me hitherto
made, ratifying & confirming this to be my last will & Testament.
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal
this 4th day of August in the year 1773.
