And the remaining part of my personal estate I will & bequeath

Legacy due at the death of my step mother in Pennsylvania
which is supposed to be worth forty pounds which sum
I allow to be equally divided amongst my seven children
as many of them as shall live till it becomes due -
I do also nominate Impower & constitute my wife Jane
& Abraham Shantz to execute this my last will &
Testament & also Trustee for my wife & my children above
mentioneds, for witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & seal the above day & year written -

I do will & bequeath unto my son James in Shelling, I
do will & bequeath unto my son Edward the one half of my
plantation including the improvements & all my body
clothes & my saddle & a scow & farm pig & these stands of
pl. as two one hand saw & three axes & a log chain
a drawing knife & those hoes & a small pot, I do will &
bequeath unto my daughter Jane three acres & there
to be of her choice of the stock, my sons Mathias and
Edward shall give the above named Jane ten bushels
of wheat & twenty bushels of corn yearly so long as
she lives unmarried, I allow the above named Jane
all my house hold furniture except one bed & bed
clothes, I also allow her one scow & iron pipe & iron
ironed Calves, I do allow her to live in the house
where she now resides & to have help in work if she
has ground yearly as long as she lives unmarried
I do bequeath unto my daughter Jane little
girl named Mary Walker my brass bed & furniture
& if my black man has a colt the ensuing summer
I allow it to the Mary Walker & the colt shall be to
the sum of one hundred if so be the 1st. said day
Walkers father shall take her away what I have
willed to her shall be given to her mother, I do will &
bequeath unto George Washington slave no. 1029 one
Molded pony, my black I allow to be sold & the money
to be equally divided between my son John Thomas
& my son James or Richard, there is three slaves which
I allow Edward to sell before his appearance of my
funeral - I do likewise the slaves here below to be

the marriage or the death of my wife 4^t I give &
bequeath unto my daughters Mary & Rachel each
of them a cow - 5th the remainder of my property to
be divided by three trustees chosen by my executors
& if the said property is valued, then my executors to
give of the said property to each of my children to the
amount of two pounds except my son Joseph, what remains
of the valuation I leave at the disposal of my beloved wife.
Lastly I do ordain & appoint my beloved wife Jane
& my son John Sloan to be the alone executors of this
last will & testament & to see that it be according to the
true intent & meaning thereof, will I do hereby revoke &
disannul all other former wills & testaments here before
by me made & do publish this & no other to be my
last will & testament this 13^d day of July 1792
