Callens the sum of ten dollars. Then I devise to my relative Eleanor Duckworth the sum of ten dollars, — Then I devise to my relative Mary and Duckworth the sum of ten dollars — Then I devise that as soon as the resources of the Estate shall fail in complying with the preceding Devises that my beloved Nephew Robert Allen furnish & pay the balance, Let it be noted & remembered that the reason why other relations are not interested & endowed in this Instrument is because my Estate does not admit of it. Finally, I do hereby constitute & appoint my above said Nephew and my true & trusty friend James Morris (Thence) the Executors of this my last Will & Testament Published this 7th day of August 1824.
