counterpane - I leave & bequeath to my daughter Ann
Berryhill a new bed table & the feathers in it & coverlet -
" I leave to William Whitsett my son in law one Dollar -
Lastly my Will is that the remainder of my property be equally
divided in and amongst Hugh Bigham, Saml Berryhill, John
Todd, Susannah Berryhill & Jo^l Hartt
" I leave to execute this my will & Testament Hugh Bigham &
Joseph Hartt - May 1st 1806
