The same to be run off the South end to be hers forever— 4th I do give & bequeath to my Bro. the Presb. Johnston the whole of my wearing apparel except such garments as my wife Jane may think proper to make choice of— 5th It is my will that all the residue of my property not expressly willed shall be sold at the price of of said sales after paying my debts to be equally divided between my wife Jane and my Daughter Sally.

6th I do nominate & appoint my Trusty friend James Johnston & Alexander Gillespie my Executors to execute this, my last will & testament. In witness whereof I the said Andrew Johnston have hereunto set my hand & seal this 1st day of January 1813

annulling & making void all former wills & Testaments by me

to the age of Twenty one years. Then I will that, that shall go out
per. I also wish the County of the County of Chesterbury to
mention distinctly this part of my will. Now & at all future times
I further give & bequeath to my wife a choice of my horses, three
horses & six sheep her choice. Also her Saddle Bed & furniture
with all her apparel then living on the plantation I now live on
during her widowhood or natural life. Allowing her the
necessary conveniences of Buildings as she now enjoys —
2^d I give unto my son Robert Garrison a negro boy Jack which
is now in his possession — 3rd I give & bequeath unto my son
William Garrison a negro boy George which he has now
in his possession — 4th I give & bequeath unto my son Arthur
a negro boy Martin. Also the plantation I now
