tract of Land I now live on the same to be run of the South
end to be hers forever— 4th I do give & bequeath to my son
The Deacon Johnston the whole of my wearing apparel
except such garments as my wife Jane may think proper to
make choice of— 5th It is my will that all the residue of my
property not expressly willed shall be sold & the proceeds of
of said sales after paying my debts to be equally divided
between my wife Jane and my daughter Sally—
6th I do nominate & appoint my Trusty friend James Johnston
Esq. Alexander Gillespie my Executors to execute this my last will

Thomson my bed and bedding—

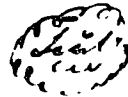
3^d I do will & bequeath unto my Grand daughter Feronia

 all the rest of my property to be equally divided between
 my son Lewis, Mary Thomas & Rachel Higgins —

I do hereby constitute & appoint my beloved son Lewis Jettison
 to be my Executor of this my last will & Testament hereby dis-
 annulling & making void all former wills & Testaments by me
 heretofore made, testifying this & none other to be my last

22 In the name of God amen. I Arthur Jamison although in a
 frail state of body yet blessed be God in a sound & tranquil state of
 mind do make this my last will & Testament as follows viz —
 1st I bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Jamison my Negro woman
 Sam, to be at her disposal until, when her child George until it come
 at the age of twenty one years. Then I will that, that child go out
 for, & also with the consent of the County of Cheeklenburg to
 sanction & ratify this part of my will. Now & at all future times
 I further give & bequeath to my wife a choice of my horses, three
 cows & six sheep her choice. Also her Saddle Bed & furniture
 with all her apparel & her living on the plantation I now live
 during her widowhood or natural life. Allowing her the
 necessary conveniences of buildings as she now enjoys —
 2^d I give unto my son Robert Jamison a negro boy Jack who
 is now in his possession. — 3^d I give & bequeath unto my son
 William Jamison a negro boy George which he has now
 in his possession — 4th I give & bequeath unto my son Arthur
 Jamison a negro boy Martin, also the plantation I now
