 And it is my will & pleasure that all the residue & remainder  
 of my property consisting of household & kitchen furniture, as  
 also some books & one more be sold & the money arising there  
 from to be equally divided among all the children that my  
 son in law Robert Lammont & my son in law George Hutchinson  
 has now at this present time after all my just & lawful  
 debts & general expenses is paid & also all the ready cash  
 that I now have to be divided in the same manner amongst  
 all the children of my said two sons in law after the following
