Testament dated the 30th day of February in the year that has just gone from me to
make weighty & lasting impressions on those who gave it to my body
to be interred with me in the like manner. I do give and bequeath
all my just debts to be paid at I do bequeath to my
beloved mother Mrs. Price my Negro Girl Della V. M. A.
Nig'd they & all the farming tools with all the black cattle
cattle in my house & all the stock to go with in & my iron
furniture & wine & beer in my bed room including chest
table &c. I do bequeath to my brother James Price
my negro boy William & my three horses named Peacock
even & Griselda & I do bequeath to Malinda my
negro girl Malinda. I do bequeath to Henry Cox
my wagon & hind gears. I do bequeath to my brother William
Pete & Isaac Price, below Henry Cox all the rest of my real
& personal after my husband & his wife are paid out, it
to be equally divided between the three last mentioned.

I do bequeath & appoint my two brothers William & James
Pete Price & George Henry my executors of this my last will
& Testament to witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 30th of February in the year of our Lord 1816.

In the name of God amen, I Elizabeth Perkins of
Weston City, knowning that it is appointed for all
persons soon to die, and as God hath blessed me with many
children, I dispose of them in the following manner
I intend to leave all my lands &able to be sold & sold &
divide my three negroes like Della, Henry & Isaac
between to my Negro woman Henry to have the custody of
my three boys while in life & I will give to her

Then I allow said three children to be emancipated & to go free but on condition that they & their descendants go free or be emancipated by the laws of their State. Henry Allow my late neice Lettie Walker & her children & Elizabeth Robbins to have each £100 per annum during their natural life & the same to be paid to them quarterly & that they make before the time of payment £100 to Lettie Walker & £100 to Elizabeth Robbins. I also give all my effects & possessions of to be equally divided between my brother John Black's children, but on condition that said three slaves shall be emancipated said Lettie Walker & her children & poor slaves no more. I appoint Henry Hunter & Samuel Huntington my whole Estate Executrix & Testamentary Power December 4th 1818

In the Name of God Amen, April 27th 1818 I Henry Huntington of Cheltenham County State of N. Carolina being greatly affected with a disease which may prove fatal do make this my last will & testament and first I command my servant to god that I give in my body to be buried in a decent Christian埋葬地 & my soul to my merciful Saviour leave it in His keeping forever & I give & bequeath to my servant cloth to be paid - I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Barbara Huntington living with me my cupboard with all its furniture my Sewing & my bedding my bed that I lie in with all its furniture a cow scuff, her choice of my flesh, A piece of horse manure a old cobler cloth now in the House and the remainder of my property to be divided as the law divides inheritance - I call for my writing instrument & appoint my son Henry Huntington to execute this my will. In Testimony of the same I have signed to it my hand & affixed my seal to this day 27th 1818
