Moore Houston, said Abeline paying unto my
estate the sum of fifty five Dollars, which fifty
five Dollars are to be divided equally among
my above named children said Abeline may
attest by my Executor - and the said James
Moore doth make and publish & declare this
Codicil part of my last will & testament
in writing whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & seal making, publishing & declaring
it part of my last will & testament as above
signed, published & declared
in presence of - this 11th day of March - 1833

1833. In the name of God. Amen.
I Elizabeth Potts of the County of Berkeley
and State of N. Carolina being somewhat indisposed
but perfectly sound in mind and memory bless
be God, for all his mercies. I do this 5th day of January
make publish and declare this to be my last will
and testament in manner following - First I
give and bequeath to my Daughter, Anna Potts the
part of the tract of land on which I have school
now in cultivation and under fence together with
as much more land to be laid off by two free-
holders as will be sufficient in their opinion to
keep the same under good fence during her so-
litude &c. the same land under cultivation
said timbered land to her and her heirs forever

I also give and bequeath to my daughter ¹⁸⁹ ~~born~~
my negro woman Clara and my negro woman
Sousana also our table our soap candlesticks
our something iron our coffee mill our Tea
Kettle my cup board & furniture all
kitchen furniture and all my household fur-
niture except bedding & also give my daugh-
ter Anne the one half of my bed and
clothing our cow and calf and the one half
of my wearing apparel that is not particu-
larly willed to others — I only I give and
bequeath to my daughter Isabella Henderson
my negro girl Cicada and the one half of my
bed and clothing and the one half of my
wearing apparel not otherwise disposed of
the same above property to my two daughters
Anne and Isabella to be theirs and their heirs
forever — Bth I give and bequeath to
my daughter Betty Henderson my white
gown and my fine table cloth — I give
and bequeath to my grandson Charles
the one half of my daughter Clara my
negro boy Tim and my gown worn to be
his and his heirs forever but the whole of said
property left to Joseph to be kept
by my daughter Anne until she the said
Joseph arrives to the age of twenty one
6th It is my will that the whole of all
of my property not bequeathed herein that

both real and personal be put to sale out of the proceeds of which I allow my just debts to be paid and should there still remain a residue after paying my debts it is my will that the same go to my Daughter Ann - 6th I do nominate constitute and appoint my son Robert Potts and my Daughter Ann Potts my Executors & Administrators to execute this my last will and testament - in witness whereof I Elizabeth Potts the testator have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal this day and year first above written in presence of
