 late son David, the price of the negro woman Sophia & fellow Mary
 to pay thirty, fifty or more to be paid within five years after my death
 provided Mary Porter & my negro Sophia should live that space of time
 5th I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Mary H. Porter one of my
 cow known by the name of Fortune & her increase I also give her my
 Spanish my wheel. 6th I give to my negro woman Sophia one of my
 brown frock & one black dress. 7th I give to my negro woman Thodas
 one of my worn Dresses to be distributed to her Sophia by Margaret as
 she thinks best. And lastly I do hereby declare my last will & Testament
 & my last Act, in witness whereof my Executions to this my last will &
 Testament. And I her the Porter have hereunto set my hand &
 had this 11th day of September in the year of our Lord 1827 —

 be good for the same, I declare that my last will & Testament is
 mine & am following by this my last will & bequeath unto my
 beloved son Russell Price a note of hand which I hold on Stephen H. Rice
 for the amount of two hundred dollars with the interest thereon

- also all my Stock of Horses, Horned Cattle & Hogs, also all the Crop I may possess at my death, also one Table & half a dozen of chairs, & also all the contents of my property not specified in this my Will; and, further in consequence of my son Reese Price receiving the above property my Will is that he give me a decent burial at my death, furnish me with a decent Marble Tombstone & pay all my just debts. 2^d I give devise & bequeath that my negro woman named Dorcas shall be sold to the best advantage & the proceeds of her sale to be appropriated in the following manner viz one fourth to my Daughter Jane Knorr of S.C. one fourth to my daughter Elizabeth Parks of Charleston S.C. one fourth to my Grand daughter Elizabeth P. Neagle Daughter of John H. Neagle & the last & fourth lot to my Grand daughter Elizabeth Knorr daughter of John & Margaret Knorr, provided nevertheless & my Will is that my son Reese Price, to whom I now request & appoint to act as her Guardian, will put her share above mentioned at my death to interest & not to pay it to her until she arrives to the age of eighteen years & my Will is that he do not lend to that age the money to be appropriated to the use of my Grand son Robert A. Knorr, & in case he should not live to the age of twenty one years at which time I allow my Executor to pay it to him, then in that case my Will is that the above bequeathed to me my wife as respects Elizabeth Knorr & Robert A. Knorr shall be equally divided amongst my other grand children.
- 3^d I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Parks my clothes & effects to have & to hold the same forever provided she has issue if she should have no children my Will is at her death that Louisa Daughter of Reese & Mary Price shall have the Clothes & effects & that my Grand son John P. Neagle shall have the Black & white man to serve. 4th I give devise & bequeath to my Grand daughter Mary Knorr one feather bed & furniture. 5th I give devise & bequeath to my Grand daughter Jane Louisa Price one feather bed & furniture. 6th I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Jane Knorr my coat board & one third of the furniture thereof also one third of my wearing apparel. — 7th I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Mary Neagle one third of my coat board, furniture & one third of my wearing apparel. 8th I give devise & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Parks one third of my coat board, furniture & one third of my wearing apparel. 9th My Will is that my negro woman serving her son John Knorr which of my three daughters or my son to her suit

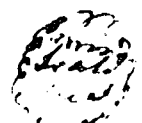

ter Elizabeth Parks one third of my cup board furniture & one third of my
wearing apparel. 9th My will is that my negro woman Jenny be
allowed her choice which of my three daughters or my son to live with
& which of them she may make her choice I shall oblige her to that one
John Henry Knorr to constitute & appoint my son Isaac Price to be the
sole Executor of this my last will & last testament & by searching & making
read all & every other will & wills at any time here to fore by me

of Richland, & State of S. Carolina, being thro' the abundant
Mercy & Goodness of God thro' to be in body yet of sound & perfect un-
derstanding & memory, do constitute this my last will & testament
& desire it may be received by all as such; First I most Humbly
bequeath my Soul to God my Mother beseeching his most gracious
acceptance of it thro' the all sufficient merits & mediation of Jesus
Christ, in so in all reference to the uttermost all that come unto
God by him; I give my body to the Earth from whence it was taken
in full assurance of its resurrection from thence at the last day
as for my burial I desire it may be decent at the discretion
of my dear wife & executor hereafter named; As to my worldly
estate I thus & particularly order that all my just debts be paid
First I give & bequeath to my dear & loving wife that part of
my plantation in which to I now live exclusive of the part that
I sold to my brother Robert to have & to hold the same as her own
property & to dispose of as she may see fit together with the whole
of the household furniture that I am possessed of likewise one
horse or mare & two cows, allowing her choice of all my stock, also
farming utensils such as may be needed for the use of the plan-
tation & likewise one half of my stock of sheep & hogs, as to the part
of my plantation that I have sold to my brother to be & if he keeps the
land agreeable to our bargain, that then I desire that he pay to my
beloved wife fifty pounds of the price of said land, and that my Executor
make to him a bill for said land, & that if he does not keep the land
tho' I then my Executor to be in what way appears best to him
of the improvement thereof as made or shall be made, I likewise
give & bequeath to my brother Robert the whole of my wearing
apparel, I likewise give & bequeath to my brother John the money
in full that he owes me in cash, none of & to be paid for him
