Second, I Will & bequeath to Dorothy Byram my daughter one scarlet
cloak & blue brocade & also an old Rock 3^d shirt & bequeath to
Sister 15 years my grand daughter to one pair of silver bracelets
& one large pearl necklace & one spinning wheel &c &c I will & bequeath
to my two daughters Estee & Dolly two Hects & a quarter of Pounds
so to be equally divided between them, 5th I Will & bequeath to
Benjamin Atchison my Grandson one brother bed, blanket & pillows
One double comback; 6th I Will that our Dutch oven two old
pots be equally divided by my executors between Estee Morris
& Dorothy Byram; 7th I Will & bequeath to the said McDowell
my daughters all the money that is in the hands of Upstone By, now
belonging to me, & what said money shall be given to her as she
needs it at the discretion of my executors. I also will that
if the said husband should die before the testator the whole of the
above mentioned money be left undivided to her, I will that the
remaining of said money shall be equally divided between
Upstone Byram & Estee Morris

I especially desire Peter & Jane's Small Committee of their day
to sit with & transact, & to transact my business & seal the day
and have said above written.

Wishes people to give & dispose of the property with which it has
pleased God to bless me with at this time with measure & power
following, First & principally. I resign my soul to God who gave

my will that all my tractable & general expenses be justly paid
as soon as convenient after my decease by my executors -
Item I will bequeath to my brother John Miller one dollar,
Item I will bequeath to Eleanor Nelson one hundred dollars
Item I will bequeath to father Wilson forty Dollars -
Item I will bequeath to Eleanor one hundred fifty dollars, and my
bed & chambered furniture; Item I will bequeath to Abby Brown
fifty dollars; Item I will bequeath to John Brown fifty dollars
Item I will bequeath to John Brown twenty dollars; Item I will
that my Library shall be equally divided between Eleanor & father
Wilson & one hundred dollars from children; Item I will bequeath four
chairs among my female friends. Item I will bequeath John Morris
my Mourning Cloak blue with a grey & brown my blanket
Item my will is that my negro boy George shall not be sold but
that he will be provided by James Wilson. Right & Robert shall make
a house for him if either of them should be absent. It is my will
also that John Morris shall have the 100 dollars left by George fifty
