ed of after my last Debt & funeral expenses be paid as follows
I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Hodge that
Tract of Land whereon I now live together with all my
Stock & Furniture whatsoever to her own use & disposal
only my Loom & Trappings to my beloved daughter Elizabeth
M^{rs} H^{er} while she remains on this place, & then to my beloved
Daughter Mary Milam, & my son the my beloved son John
Hodge - And I do hereby constitute & appoint my beloved
wife Elizabeth Hodge & John Lemmon & James Pitts
as my Executors to this my last will & Testament as
witness my hand & seal this 9th day of December 1809
