Polly Sharpe, one bed, one chair, one stool, one pair double flannel to Abigail

6<sup>th</sup> I give the to Rebecca Miller one sugar basin - 7<sup>th</sup> I give each  
to Polly Patterson one calico gown & one Quilted cover -  
8<sup>th</sup> I give each to Polly Sharpe one brown coat & blue skirt &

two Chairs, &c. I allow my Executor to divide the residue of my clothing & Wearing apparel between Dennis & Martha & Abby Patterson, equally. 10<sup>th</sup> I allow my Executors to collect the legacy amount from Richard Rankin & his wife to divide my third part of the farm except 26 Bushels C.W. Patterson was to have for managing the same & every other species of my property he can provide for his use & defray expenses of his trouble. And I hereby appoint my trusty friend George Stranahan as Executor of this my last will & Testament, in witness whereof I the said Frankley McKittrick have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year written beneath.
