 6th I bequeath to Rebecca Walker one sugar bowl - 7th I bequeath
 to Polly Walker one calico gown & one quilted cover -
 8th I bequeath to Polly Sharpe one brown cloth coat & one chest

two Chais, 9th I allow my Executor to divide the residue of my clothes
 & wearing apparel between Dorcas Shandels & Peggy Patterson equally
 10th I allow my Executor to collect the Sogary coming from Richard
 Rankin & further to receive my third part of the Corn except 20 Bushels
 & W^m Patterson was to have for mending the same & every other
 species of my property he can find for his use by defraying expenses
 & his trouble. And I hereby appoint my trusty friend George
 Alexander as Executor of this my last will & Testament, in witness
 whereof I the said Franky McKibben have hereunto set my hand
 & seal the day & year within written

 Exercise of my mind, make & constitute this my last will & Testament
 First. It is my will that my funeral expenses & all my lawful Debts be
 punctually & faithfully discharged. 2^d I will to my beloved wife
 Martha my several mare, her saddle & bridle, three cows & calves to
 one D. d. 3^d It is my will that my negro boy Abram, Negro Women
 Fan & two children W^m Phellis & Mary together with the whole of
 my Sheep & Hog Stock & every mare join with necessary farming
 utensils, together with as much Household & Kitchen furniture as
 may be thought proper by my Executors for the present use of said
 family be continued on the farm during the natural life or
 widowhood of my beloved wife or the arrival of my heirs being of
 full age or any other period that circumstances of family & the
 Judgment of said Executors may point out, & that then the
 whole of the property herein mentioned with the increase or
 decrease, the same may be sold for the best price & the monies
 arising from said sale be equally divided between my beloved
