In the name of God Amen. This 6th day of July 1816
I Anna Emerson of the County of Rockbridge in the State of Virginia
being old & feeble in years & calling to mind my mortality
& that it is appointed for all men to die. Do make this my last will
and Testament: First I recommend my soul to God who gave it
my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent manner. And as
touching my worldly estate It is my will & desire that my funeral
expenses be paid & satisfied—2^d I give & bequeath to my loving
daughter Catey Nops for the love good will & affection I have
to her this plantation whereon I now live containing one
hundred & Twenty acres more or less. And for the kindness
that my Grand daughter has paid to me. That is to say Nancy
Green I do give & bequeath to her son further land & furniture
hereby revoking & disannulling all other wills & bequests
by me heretofore. Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be
my last will & Testament. Signed sealed pronounced &
delivered by the said Anna Emerson as her last will and
testament in presence of

In the name of God Amen. July 30th 1814 Frederick Eggle being
so advanced in years & calling to mind the mortality of my body.
& that it is appointed for all men to die & after death the
judgment. Altho' being of perfect mind & memory I aches to go
to God therefore. Do make & ordain this my last will & testament
1st. And principally & first of all I recommend my soul to God that

gave it, and my body to the ground to be buried in a decent form and manner at the discretion of my executors.


I doth for as much of my property to be sold as will pay all my just and lawful debts & the remainder of what property God has been to bless me with in this world to be divided in the following manner viz —

I give & bequeath unto my dearly & well beloved wife Mary Egell her heirs together with my farm house with all the kitchen furniture with two cows of her own choosing by her freely to be possessed & enjoyed. & to her at her disposal forever & likewise I do now & declare that she then said Mary Egell do have the use of my wages by name of James for his lifetime & at his death to go to my daughter Phoebe Houston, now Fishawick & Culver & allow that my wife Mary Egell be possessed of the interest of the plantation where I now live during her lifetime. & at her death to go to my son Frederick & leg him fully to be possessed & enjoyed forever, & likewise I allow & declare that my son Frederick Egell do possess my other two tracts viz one hundred acres on the waters of Lachance branch & forty acres on six mile creek joining Dall's line by him freely to be possessed & enjoyed forever. & likewise I allow my son Frederick to have my Negro man named Tony by him freely to be possessed & enjoyed forever I further allow my daughter Phoebe to get one hundred dollars out of the rest of my property. And there is but remains after she gets her hundred dollars the remainder to be sold and equally divided between or among my wife & my son Frederick & my daughter Phoebe by them to be possessed & enjoyed forever —

I do choose & declare that my true & trusty friends Frederick Egell my son & James Hinds to be the executors of this my last will & testament fully & I do this & no other to be my last will & testament fully & completely & changing all other wills that might here before been made. In witness whereof I have this day set my hand & affixed my seal this 130th day of July 1814

With the remainder of his/her property God has been to bless me with in
this world to be divided in the following manner viz

I give & bequeath unto my dearly & well beloved wife Mary Egell her bed
& furniture together with my sootl house with all the kitchen furniture
lawn with two acres of her lawn choosing by her freely to be possessed
& enjoyed. To her at her disposal forever. Likewise I allow & ordain
that she the said Mary Egell do have the use of my negro boy
named JAMES his lifetime & at her death to go to my daughter Mary
Hannum. Likewise I ordain & allow that my wife Mary Egell be
possessor of the one third of the plantation where I now live during
her lifetime. & at her death to go to my son Frederick they being jointly
to be possessed & enjoyed forever. Likewise I allow & ordain that
my son Frederick Egell do possess my other two tracts viz one
hundred acres on the waters of Lachance branch & forty acres on
Six mile creek having Dollars due by him freely to be passed to
enjoyed forever. Likewise I allow my son Frederick to have my
Negro man named JAMES by him freely to be possessed & enjoyed forever
I further allow my daughter Mary Hannum to get one hundred dollars
out of the rest of my property. And there is but remains after
she gets one hundred dollars the remainder to be sold and
equally divided between or among my wife & my son Frederick
& my daughter Mary Hannum by them to be possessed & enjoyed forever —
And I do choose & ordain that my three & twenty friends Frederick Egell
my son & James Bonds to be the executors of this my last will & testament
fully & I do this & no other to be my last will & testament & fully
disowning & denying all other wills that might here before been
made. In witness whereof I have set my hand & affixed my
Seal this 180th day of July 1814
