In the name of God Amen, I George Davis of Aicklenburg & County  
& State of N. Carolina, being weak in body but of sound mind & memory  
Thanked be to God for, therefore calling to mind & memory the mortality  
of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die  
Do make & declare this my last Will & Testament that is to say  
principally & first of all I give my soul into the hand of Almighty  
God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be  
buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors  
and touching such worldly Estate therewith it hath pleas-  
ed God to bless me in this life, I give & dispose of the same  
in the following manner & form Viz 1<sup>st</sup> I give & bequeath unto  
my beloved son James, G. Davis Twelve pounds Ten Shillings when  
he comes, at the age of 21 to be paid by my Executors

2<sup>nd</sup> I give & bequeath to my beloved son Great Davis Twelve Shillings to be  
paid as before mentioned. — Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my beloved son Robert  
Davis one French Crown at my decease. Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my beloved  
son William Davis one French Crown at my decease

5<sup>th</sup> I further allow that all the residue of my property therefore  
not bequeathed, I give unto my beloved son John Davis my  
Executor & that all my lawful Debt be paid out of the same  
and that the balance if any to said Executors use, and further  
I do declare & appoint my beloved son John Davis to execute  
this my last Will & Testament In witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19<sup>th</sup> day  
of June in the year of our Lord 1807.
