since at his mother's death to him & his heirs forever in fee simple, in trust
whereof I do hereby set my hands & affix my seal this 28th day of December
1800 witness

State of Virginia, being at present weak in body but of a sound disposing
mind blessed by God, and calling to mind the mortality of the body & that it
is appointed for all men once to die, do make & publish this my last will &
testament in presence of my self & following witnesses I will that my just debts,
funeral expenses be paid & discharged as soon as convenient after my death
I give & be generally unto my well beloved wife Ruthenize all my
property of whatsoever kind including my increasing apparel & household
goods clear to me the paying out of the same one dollar unto my
daughter Mary wife to Andrew Presley & that at any time when de-
manded after my death, I bid lastly I do hereby nominate my
son in law Joseph C. C. Compton to be the sole executor of this my
last will, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made
ratifying & confirming this to be my last will. In witness whereof
I have set my hand & affixed my seal this 6th day of May
1802 signed, sealed, published & pronounced
by the said George Horner to be his last will in the presence
of us who at his request have subscribed our names
as witnesses
