

for their use & each of them to be paid their share at the age of Twenty one years & if should so happen that any of the three Children here mentioned should die before they are Twenty one years of age then I will that their share be given to the Survivors, one Hundred dollars to my wife as before mentioned And the remainder of the money arising from the sale to be Equally divided between my three Children Elizabeth wife to William Hawey, Jane wife to William Stewart & Ann wife to John Houston share & share alike And Lastly I Do hereby nominate & appoint my son George & my sons in law William Hawey, William Stewart & John Houston Executors of this my last will & Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me heretofore made, testifying & confirming this to be my last will & Testament; In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 26th of Decem^r 1803 Signed sealed published & pronounced by the said John Hawey to be his last will & Testament in the presence of us who at his request have subscribed our names as witnesses

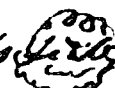
" In the Name of God Amen, I George Harkness of the State of N^c Carolina York County, being weak of Body but of perfect mind & memory thank to Almighty God for all his mercies to me, & calling to mind the mortality of all flesh & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do make & declare this my last will & Testament, And first of all I recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God my Saviour that give it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be decent Christian buried at the discretion of my Executors, Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall revive the same by the mighty power of God my Saviour - And as to my worldly estate that it has pleased God to bless me with, I dispose of in the following manner

I bequeath to Mary, my beloved wife a horse, saddle & bed and furniture she living with the family during her widowhood. I allow all my property to be sold at public sale except two horses & two cows for the use of the family, and all my lawful debts truly to be paid & the remainder of the money to be laid out in Land for the four boys who is to have an equal divide as they come of age I do allow to the youngest boy to keep his mother & to his two share accordingly. I bequeath unto Jesse & Jenny Child ~~Thirteen~~ Dollars, I bequeath unto Eli & Mary Child fifteen Dollars. I bequeath unto Thomas & Margaret Brady three dollars, I bequeath my daughter Sonima Harkness one hundred Dollars & her bed. I do bequeath unto my Daughter Anna one hundred dollars or a horse & saddle & bed in Linn Town of Virginia the same as Anna the which sum truly to be paid to them when they of age if they stay in the family, I do further declare that if any of them will turn Rebels I will not be advised by the Executors but will go away from the family, I do allow them three dollars either boy or girl and no more.

I do constitute & declare Mary Harkness my wife & my son Thomas truly sole Executors of my last Will & Testament revoke & disannul all former Testaments confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament. In witness where of I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 16th day of July in the year of our Lord 1807 and 32 of our Independence. NB I do empower the Executors to make a sufficient to any person for the Land.
