 do make & publish this to be my last Will & Testament in the
 manner & form following that is to say first I do give & bequeath
 unto my beloved wife Dicy Hutchinson first her Dower of my
 plantation wherein I now live 2^d I bequeath unto her two
 negroes her choice of the family in natural life one of which
 at her death to be at her disposal, also if either of her negroes
 should die she shall have her choice of a young female during
 her natural life in rearing my son Thomas, free, from charge
 untill he shall come of age. Also I bequeath unto my son
 William Hutchinson a plantation containing one hundred &
 fifty three acres siting, Robert Loomis, Robert Montgomery
 & Thomas Horner on the West of Sugar Creek & one young
 negro girl named Huldah this Horse & saddle & one bed & furniture
 Also I bequeath unto my son John Hutchinson two negro
 Girls named Charlotte & Dorsey one bed & furniture & one horse
 & saddle them to be given him when he comes of age.
 I also bequeath to my son James Hutchinson a negro girl
 named Rachel also his horse & saddle I also bequeath unto
 my son Thomas Hutchinson one negro boy named Brazil &
 his Horse & saddle & one bed & furniture & the plantation I
 now live on when he comes of age. I also allow my son
 to continue at the Learning untill he gets a liberal Educa-
 tion & then my son shall pay him one hundred dollars at
 his coming of age. I also do allow this to be the full share
 that I allow my son James Hutchinson; I also do allow
 my two sons William & John Hutchinson to be made
 equal at the dividing of my Estate agreeable to Quantity
 & Quality; I also do allow my son Thomas to have
 a negro girl at the division of my Estate this to be his
 full share of my estate; I also do allow the remain-
 ing part of my property to remain in the possession of
 my wife Dicy during her natural life except the my

Manner & form following that is to say first I do give & bequeath
unto my beloved wife Dicy Hutchinson first her Dower of my
plantation whereon I now live 2^d I bequeath unto her two
negroes her choice of the family her natural life or of which
at her death to be at her disposal, also if either of her negroes
should die she shall have her choice of a young woman during
her natural life her nursing my son Thomas, free, from charge
until he shall come of age. Also I bequeath unto my son
William Hutchinson a plantation containing one hundred &
fifty three acres siting Robert Leonard, Robert Montgomery
& Thomas Horan on the waters of Sugar Creek & one young
negro girl named Hedy this Horse & saddle & one bed & furniture
Also I bequeath unto my son John Hutchinson two negroes
girls named Charlotte & Betsy one bed & furniture & one horse
& saddle them to be given him when he comes of age.
I also bequeath to my son James Hutchinson a negro girl
named Rachel also his horse & saddle I also bequeath unto
my son Thomas Hutchinson one negro boy named Hazel &
his Horse & saddle & one bed & furniture & the plantation I
now live on when he comes of age. I also allow my son
to continue at the Learning until he gets a liberal Educa-
tion & then my son shall pay him one hundred dollars at
his coming of age. I also do allow this to be the full share
that I allow my son James Hutchinson; I also do allow
my two sons William & John Hutchinson to be made
equal at the dividing of my Estate agreeable to quantity
& quality; I also do allow my son Thomas to have
a negro girl at the division of my Estate this to be his
full share of my estate; I also do allow the remain-
ing part of my property to remain in the possession of
my wife Dicy during her natural life except the negs
I also allow the remaining part of my negroes to be equally
divided between my two sons William & John Hutchin-
son when Thomas comes of age; I also do allow the
increase of my negroes to be equally among my two

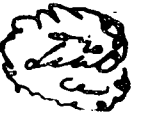
your children - I do allow myself a decent but plain
Burial & all my Personal debts discharged - I also
consider this my last Will & Testament - I also constitute
my friends Jacob & Thomas & William Leitch my Executors
revoking all former Wills & Testaments. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 6th
day of January 1810.

memory, Thro' the Mercy of God & knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die, I make this my last Will & Testament & desire
it may be received by all as such, I humbly begue with my soul
to God my maker, & my body to the Earth from whence it was
taken in full assurance of its resurrection at the last day -
I desire my burial may be decent - My worldly estate which
It hath pleased God to bless me with, I desire it may be dispos-
ed of after my last Debt, & funeral expenses be paid as follows
I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Hodge the
Tract of Land whereon I now live together with all my
Stock & Furniture whatsoever to her own use & dispose of
only my Loom & Trappings to my beloved daughter Elizabeth
M^{rs} Hodge while she remains on this place, & then to my beloved
Daughter Mary Milner, & my saddle my beloved son John
Hodge - And I do hereby constitute & appoint my beloved
wife Elizabeth Hodge & John Larrison & James Potts
as my Executors to this my last Will & Testament as
in Witness my hand & seal this 9th day of December 1809
