I George Parks of the said County above mentioned -
being weak of body, yet of sound & perfect mind standing
& memory, Do make & publish this my last will & testament
& desire it may be recorded by all as such. First I bequeath
my soul to God & my body to the best of his service.

If it through the merciful Providence of Jesus Christ
my Redeemer; I do beseech him to give my body to the
Earth from whence it took in full & particular of its Re-
surrection at the last day: As to my worldly concerns
my burial I desire it to be without pomp at the direction
& discretion of my wife & children hereafter named -

First I give & bequeath to my wife the house that I now
live in, & the out buildings belonging to the premises & as
much of the land as will support the family my waggon
& cart, excepted, the two horses, two barrows & one, a
two horse plow, & harness, also to my wife for the support
of my family, the half of cattle her choice of the Stock
& all my hogs & geese & twelve head of sheep, and two
horses geld & buck, also my machine & two thirds of the
house hold & kitchen furniture her choice of it to the use
of my wife during her widow hood, all the above property
but no longer. I give & bequeath to my wife as her above
late Right person to dispose of as she thinks proper my
negro girl Isbell, the Servt more tell two beds & furniture
& the Clock - I also give & bequeath to my sons all the lands
of which I am possessed to be equally divided among them
except the Story place which I allow to be sold and a
reasonable reddit given, the division of my land will
be made when my son other comes of age. - I'll also
that my Negro Girl Linda be sold to my other three negroes
be kind ent. to wit God kind for the support of the family
Edmond & Sarah for the benefit of the Esther and when my
son other comes of age, James & Other shall receive them
equal share of the property & personalty that will remain

I George Parks of the State of Kentucky above mentioned -
being weak of body, yet of sound & perfect mind & memory,
doe contrite this my last will & testament
& desire it may be witnessed by all as such. First I bequeath
my soul to God & my body to the grave & dust hence -

by it through the imminent judgment of our Christ
my Redeemer; I beseech him graciously to give my body to the
Earth from whence it took its first appearance of its Res-
urrection at the last day; As to my worldly concerns
my burial I desire it to be without pomp at the discretion
& direction of my wife Elizabeth hereafter named -

First I give & bequeath to my wife the house that I now
live in & the rest building belonging to the premises & as
much of the land as will support the family my waggon
& gear, excepted, the two horses, two mares & one, &
two sheep shear, & harness, also to my wife for the support
of my family, the half of cattle her choice of the Stock
& all my hoggs & geese & twelve head of sheep, and two
horses geld & buck, also my machine & two thirds of the
house hold & kitchen furniture her choice of it to the use
of my wife during her widow hood, all the above property
but no longer. I give & bequeath to my wife as her above
late Right person to chosen of as she thinks proper my
negro Girl Isbell. The several mare shall two bed & furniture
& the clock - I also give & bequeath to my sons all the lands
of which I am possessed to be equally divided among them
except the Story place which I allow to be sold and a
reasonable credit given, The division of my land will
be made when my son John comes of age - It will also
that my negro Girl Linda be sold & my other negroes
be hired out to wit Job hired for the support of the family
Edmond & Sarah for the benefit of the Estabon land when my
son John comes of age, James & Atha shall receive their
equal share of the negroes & money that will arise, from
the sale of property & hire of negroes, and all my sons.

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And Daughters shall have equal share in the property & money
when James & Allen receive their part the remainder shall
continue in our hands with the better benefit of my children
who are minors & as they become of age they shall receive each
one their half - I will give full & just account of my Estate to
my brothers & sisters to each of whom the amount of money
will be known by my father, also also that my Executors at
the division of the land divide each a portion of the land
as they may claim necessary for the support of my wife
during her life if she remains a widow. Also I constitute
and appoint John Weeks & Samuel Williamson my Executrix
of this my last Will & Testament - signed & dated with my
hand this 30th day of December anno Domini 1826.
