

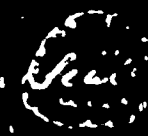
In the name of God Amen, I George Rofs being weak in body
 out of perfect mind & memory thanks be to God, I hereby
 acting in mind the mortality of my body & knowing that
 it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this
 my last will & Testament, That it to say principally & first
 of all I give & bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty
 God that gave it to be disposed of at his pleasure & my body
 I recommend to be buried in the Earth in a decent manner
 at the discretion of my Executors, And as touching such
 worldly Estate whereunto it pleased God to bless me in
 this life, I give bequeath & dispose of the same in the follow-
 ing manner & form viz. I give & bequeath to Margret Rofs
 my dearly beloved wife the one half of all that Messuage
 or Tract of Land on which I now dwell including the
 Buildings thereon for & during her natural life, Also I
 give unto my said wife her best bed & furniture one black
 man called Paul, one saddle & bridle, five head Cows &
 half of the plantation Tools for her bandry to be continued
 on the plantation for the use thereof, I further give &
 bequeath unto my wife all the Sheep except two ewes
 & the one half of the hogs—Then I give & bequeath unto Robt^t
Rofs my beloved son twelve pound seven shillings paid for him
 in the way of Debt, Then I give & bequeath to Catherine Rofs
 my dearly beloved daughter one horse named Verbling one
 saddle & bridle, one man one bed & furniture & one spin-
 ning wheel, & one Cow called Daisy & a two year old
 Moley Heifer & two Ewes & a breeding sow, Then I give &
 bequeath unto my beloved son George Rofs the remain-
 ing half of the plantation & Tools for her bandry what-
 soever Margret Rofs his mother liveth & after her death it is
 my will & pleasure that him his Heirs or assigns get all
 in said Tract of Land improvements & Tools for Husbandry
 next in case George Rofs my son dies not having lawful
 Heirs Then my will & pleasure is that the two third parts
 said must be given & equally divided between my daughter
Catherine Rofs my son Robert Rofs & John Rofs, but
 that the remaining third part of the land be equally

Divided between my daughters Catherine Reps & Margaret
Hunter, I further give & bequeath unto my son George one horse &
 saddle, bridle & boots & furniture & one cow called white face
 I her Heifer & the ~~remaining~~ half of the pigs, I likewise give &
 bequeath unto my son George out of my
 wife Margaret Reps's Mans bedroom chamber the loom & the st.
lino for the benefit of the family & at the death of my wife
 I allow her to dispose of said chamber & furniture at her
 pleasure, I further give & bequeath unto my daughter
Margaret Hunter one new ribble & and I do hereby constitute
 & appoint Margaret Reps my beloved wife & George Reps
 my beloved son to be my sole Executors of this my last will
 & Testament; & do hereby disallow, Disavow & disannul
 all & every other & former wills, Testaments, Legacies & Executions
 by me in every wise made written or bequeathed in form
 hereby Relieving this & no other to be my last will & Testament.
 In witness whereof I have signed my hand this 13th day of July 1798
 signed, sealed pronounced & delivered by the said
George Reps as his last will & Testament in the
 presence of us, who in his presence, & in the presence
 of each other have hereunto subscribed our names
