22 In the name of God Amen. I James Harris of the County of Loudoun & State of
Virginia being of sound & perfect mind & memory (blessed be God) do this
day of September in the year of our Lord 1803 make & publish this my
last will & Testament in manner following. First I give & bequeath
to my son James Harris one hundred dollars worth of property
to him. To my daughter Margaret I will & bequeath one
Negro Girl named Alice. To my Grand daughter Eliza
I will one bed & furniture. To my son Grand
child John Polly H. Harris, Samuel J. Harris, Polly & Elizabeth
I will & bequeath one Negro boy named
Anthony to be sold & the money arising from the sale to be
divided between them three & three alike. To my
Grand Daughter Rebecca Harris if she should live to be 16
years of age I will one Negro Girl named Fess & in case she
should not, then I allow said Negro Girl to go to the use of

my Grand Daughter Eliza Alexander & Mary Alexander share and have alike— Item to my Grandson James W. Alexander I will one hundred & fifty dollars— Item to my Grand daughter Mary Alexander I will Twenty Dollars— Item To my son Jonathan Harris I will & bequeath the whole of the remainder of my Estate as follows Negroes Sophia, Alice or what ever kind of property there may be And I hereby make & declare Jonathan Harris executor of this my last will & Testament— In witness whereof I the said Grace Harris have to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal the day & year above written in the presence of us.

I Thomas Herson at present of the County of Heculaburg & State of Georgia taking into consideration the Mortality of man & knowing that it is appointed for all mankind once to die & find myself in a low state of health through of perfect mind & memory & to heres it hath pleased God to bless me with some of the good things of this life, It is my Will & desire to dispose of them in the following manner legible to this my last will & Testament— Imprimis I bequeath my Soul to God who gave it & my body to the Earth from whence it came to be decently buried at the direction of my Executors which I appoint to be paid out of the whole of my Estate— 2^d It is my Will & desire that all my Just debts should be paid out of my Estate as soon as my Estate can be settled— 3^d It is my Will & desire that all my lands lying on the South waters of Savannah Creek, Fairfield district South Carolina, near to Rocky Mount, one tract containing five hundred acres adjoining land of Richard Gater & Mr Poll carpenter, another tract containing one hundred & fifty acres adjoining Mr Poll on the other side Opposite the other tract also one small tract of fifty acres lying long side the second tract shall be sold & out of the neat monies arising therefrom my Just debts be all paid also five hundred dollars yearly be
