she can get rid of him from Slabtown so that she dont care to keep him
I allow my executors to make sale of him & money arising herefrom
to be equally divided amongst my children I let her give & bequeath
to my loving wife the house I now live in & plantation adjoining
it during her widowhood one two year old grey colt on horse
called Rose horse one mare called Mulligan mare & also four Welsh
horses two two year old others two yearlings as she shall see cause to
be out of my stock likewise my Stock of Hogs, like wife my son
& other grain that is useful for the family & such tools as she thinks
will be most useful for the plantation — Then I give & bequeath
unto my beloved sons David & James after their mothers wedowhood
or death the plantation I now live on & all my lands adjoining to it
including three deeds — Then I give & bequeath to my beloved
son John three hundred acres of Land lying & being in the County of
Rockingham in the province of N^o Carolina on Broadhead creek
the Patent bearing date the 30th of January 1773 & number 465 —
Then I give & bequeath to my beloved daughters Agnes & Mary
hundred pounds lawful money, and all other effects to be sold &
equally divided among my sons, likewise I desire my brother
should not be sold but converted to the use of my children as
their mother shall see cause for welfare whereof I have
set my hand and — Notary present

In the Name of God Amen, I Halbert Hall late of Rowan
County & State of N^o Carolina, but now residing in Rockingham
county with Thomas Hall son in the State aforesaid, being for
some time sickly & weak in body, and blind in the Lord
in the proper use & exercise of my reason, and calling to mind my
mortality & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die
do think it proper to my this my last Will and Testament

And first I recommend my soul to God who gave it & my body
to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my friends
as it hath pleased God to bless me with a little of this world's goods
I choose to dispose of the same in the following manner & if
I allow all my just debts to be discharged - Item I bequeath
unto my Aunt Bridget Hayes the sum of twenty five Pounds.
Item I bequeath unto my Cousin William Hale Sixty pounds.
Item as a token of my sincere regard to the Revd Robert Brink
& Thomas C. Hall I bequeath to each of them Ten Pounds -
Item I bequeath unto my dear & loving Brothers Sam'l & Wm. Hales
Half of all my now in Ireland all the rest or the remainder
all I am possessed of to them & in case of their being removed by death
into the Eternal world I then allow it to be given away before
mention'd to the nearest in blood as the law directs -

Yours I'm mind & constituted in, love & friendship, friend Thomas McPhee
to be my only Executor of this my last will & Testament, & his Executors
presently to revocate all other Wills & Testaments which you may have
acknowledging this as my last will & such sign it & witness
I have & seal it with my seal & acknowledge this 16th day
September in the Year 1782.

first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of the
God who gave it, & my body to his wise providence & soon
as I die all Estate wherewithal it hath pleased God to bestow on
