In the Name of God, amen. The 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1874 I, Jessie Barker of the County of Mecklenburg, State of North Carolina being sick & weak in body, but of sound mind & memory, and calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die. Do make & declare this my last Will & Testament, and as touching such worldly estate wherewithal I have been possessed God to bless me in this life, I give & bequeath of the same in the following manner & even viz After all my legal debts are paid I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Polly all my household furniture my gray mare & a mule & cow. The remainder of my property to be left under the direction of my executors for the purpose of raising my family during my widowhood or until the all come of age, then the property not bequeathed to be sold & equally divided among my children. But if my daughter Anna Maria does not answer the purpose of raising my family my executors are authorized to sell or dispose of her as they think best for the good of my children -

And I do hereby constitute & appoint my trustee power

James Foster & Samuel Beck my executors, and I do appoint  
Thomas Greenfield & Joseph Atkinson Jr. as fiduciaries over all my chil-  
dren; and I do hereby direct and command other friends with  
whom I have conversed, to carry my instructions that it will be my last  
will & testament to be witnessed by whom I have designated, set my hand  
thereon at my signature where written, and my  
signature shall be taken and witnessed by whom  
I am witness you do now sign this instrument. *Seal*  
This 20th day of June 1833.

In the name of God amen. I John Black of the County of Mecklenburg  
State of North Carolina, being in health & of sound mind, calling to  
mind what it is appointed for all men on earth to do, made & publish this my  
last will & testament in my presence as follows:

Item: First of all I commit my soul unto God who gave it, not out of fear  
but knowing He who will receive it into Heaven abundantly through  
Jesus Christ. My body to the church to be buried in a Christian manner  
and at the discretion of my executors.

Item: I leave my quiet & comfortable home and all my worldly property  
Item: It is my wish that my last will & wife Mary Black here all the  
household, my children she brought here when we were married  
and of course, the Gray House, there about & all that is yet due  
me from the estate of her son John Walker deceased, her saddle  
& bridle & spurs, which, with the one third of the plantation  
I bequeath him during his natural life.

Item: I make & give such to my son John Black the plantation herein  
on I now live including, my different houses supposed to be  
two hundred thirty four acres of land excepted during  
his life & after his decease the whole (add to be my son John  
Black) & his heirs, or me, by giving Hester Hallen a house  
worth Sixty Dollars & my great grand daughter Martha Black  
ten dollars -- Item. And all the rest of my property 123  
acres hundred acres of land in the West in Surry, Virginia  
Hills, Lathrop, & <sup>Decker</sup> ~~Decker~~ Hills 1783-1843 to me of my son  
John Black & his heirs, or me with his wife
