On the 20th of March in the year of our Lord 1812 Harry Emerson
Jewl. of Charlotte Mecklenburg County & Carolina Being in a
very low weak state of body but of sound mind & memory, sent
for & called Doctor Thomas Henderson, William Carson, William
Allison Barto & William Allison said who being all present
did them & themselves in the presence & hearing of us the above named
doctors & say that his object in calling us was that he the said
Harry Emerson just had made no' t ill, that he gave the
whole of his property to his wife except two negro boys which
he gave to his brother Billy Emerson being asked by Dr. T.
Thomas Henderson the names of the two negro boys, he said he
left his two negro boys one named Harry & the other named
Bart to his brother Billy Emerson, and all his other property
to his wife & not a shilling to any other person, which he
directed us or some of us to commit to writing within the
time specified by law.

of March 1812.
