 the morrow of God and knowing that it is appointed for all me-
 nes to die, I make this my last will & testament & desire it to be
 recd by all as such. — I humbly begueth my soul to God:
 my & thine & my body to his torture from whence it was taken in full
 assurance of its resurrection at the last day: I desire that my burial
 may be decent, and to manage it at the discretion of my dear children
 who I cannot not well manage it with all requisite solemnity
 My worldly estate which it hath pleased God to bless me with
 I desire may be disposed of after just debts & funeral expenses be
 paid as follows: — Then I give & bequeath to my beloved son Thos
Downs the tract of Land between me now lies containing two hundred
 & ten acres purchased of Henry Weston of Middlebury likewise one other
 tract lying containing fifty acres by grant from George the Third of
 Great Britain, I bequeath the aforesaid lands to him the said Thos
Downs his heirs & assigns, likewise all my wearing apparel
 Then I give & bequeath to my beloved son Samuel Downs the tract of land
 wherein he lies, containing five hundred acres by grant bearing date
 the twenty third day of December one thousand seven hundred & sixty three
 to him or other tract containing one hundred & nineteen acres by grant
 from the State bearing date the 28th day of August 1795, I bequeath the
 aforesaid lands to him the said Samuel Downs his heirs & assigns for ever
 Likewise one rifle gun which he hath now in possession
 Then I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Jane Robbins thefe she shall
 have clothe a American style — Then I give & bequeath to my beloved daugh-
 ter Kitty Brastor a Chest of Drawers which now stands at John Rob-
 bins & likewise one blue Beret located which I have in possession
 Let the remainder of my Estate in netas Head or account I desire
 may be recovered and equally divided among my four children
 Jane Robbins, Thomas Downs, Samuel Downs & Kitty Brastor I
 desire my negro wench Hannah may be sold & the money arising
 from the sale may be equally divided as above among my four children
 and as there is no more properly worth making sale of I desire it may
 be given to my executors & trustees as my trustees may think proper

my Father & my body to the Earth from whence it was taken in the
affirmation of its Resurrection at the last day: I desire that my soul
may be decently buried at the discretion of my executors
who I doubt not will manage it with all Requisite prudence.
My worldly Estate which it hath pleased God to bless me with
I desire may be disposed of after just debts & funeral expenses be
paid as follows:—Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son Thomas
Downs the tract of Land between one acre less containing two acres
the more purchased of Henry Weston & Cullot, likewise one other
tract bearing containing fifty acres by grant from George the Third of
Great Britain, I bequeath the aforesaid lands to him the said Thomas
Downs his Heirs & assigns, however, likewise all my living apparel
Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son Samuel Downs the tract of land
whereon he bears containing five hundred acres by grant bearing date
the Twenty third day of December in the year thousand seven hundred and sixty three
likewise one other tract containing one hundred & nine acres by grant
from the State bearing date the 28th day of August 1795, I bequeath the
aforesaid lands to him the said Samuel Downs his Heirs & assigns forever
& likewise one Negroe woman which he hath now in possession
Item I give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter Jane Robinson, the first
and either whercon I lie — Item I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter
the Negroe Bessie a Chest of Drawers which now stands at John Robins
sons & likewise one blue Kerchief located which I have in possession
all the remainder of my Estate in other hand or account I desire
may be recovered and equally divided among my four children
Jane Robinson, Thomas Downs, Samuel Downs & Nelly Braxton I
desire my Negro woman Hannah may be sold & the money arising
from the sale may be equally divided as above among my four children
and as there is no more properly worth making sale of I desire it may
be given however my executors lighter as my trustees may think proper
and I do hereby constitute & appoint my beloved sons Thomas Downs, S.
Downs & John Robinson as my trustees to the my last will & Testament, so it is done
in hand & seal this tenth day of August April 1797
