 blessed God has blessed me with in this life I give & dispose of the
 same as follows: Viz. First I will that my last debts & funeral
 expenses be paid & discharged as soon as convenient after my decease
hereinafter I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Elinor all the pro-
 perty I have with all my outstanding debts after my first debts is
 paid only one year and no longer, I give to my sister Fanny, I give
 my 1/2 of the lands during her life time only she is to maintain
 my mother in it, if my wife should die before my mother I will
 that my executor should rent out my land for the maintenance of
 my mother & after the death of mother & wife I will that my land
 should be sold by my executor & the monies arising from said sale
 to be equally divided between Joseph W. W. Wharton John F.
Wharton Harriet W. Wharton sons. Merlin Thompson Harriet
Thompson son, Golden W. Wharton Fanny W. Wharton son
 I hereby nominate constitute & appoint Charles Polk the sole
 executor of this my last will & Testament, hereby revoking all
 other wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
