In the name of God Amen. July 27th 1825—

I Catherine Wallace of the County of New London &
 State of N Carolina being in a low state of health but
 of sound mind & knowing that it is appointed for all
 to die, Do make & declare this my last will, which
 is as follows. After my death I allow my body to
 be buried in a decent Christian like manner at
 the discretion of my Executors including a hearse
 for my grave worth ten or twelve dollars. —

I bequeath to my brother Matthew Wallace twenty
 dollars; I give & bequeath to my niece Catherine
 Wallace Twenty five dollars & all my body clon-
 ing including two unfinished bed quilts with
 the materials for making them out. I give to my
 & Catherine Wallace my brothers daughters to be
 equally divided between them. I bequeath to
 John W Wilson Twenty dollars, and I allow
 five dollars for the use of Bethany Church to be
 applied towards the building of a meeting
