 State of North Carolina being infirm & memory lost knowing
 that it is opportune for all men over to die. Do make this my
 last will & testament viz first I bequeath & command my soul
 to God that gave it, my body to the earth take buried in a chris-
 tian manner at the discretion of my executors & if my wife
 Estrella whom I leave it to the pleasure of God to keep me with, I give &
 dispose of her the following sum money \$1000. Sterl. & positively
 order that all my just debts be paid. I bequeath & command
 unto my son Abel Barnett the plantation he now lies on
 with part of the plantation I now lie on beginning on Boundary
 line on a rock & Hitter by the plantation fence thereon a straight
 line to a white oak tree by the old fence then through the old field
 to a pasture on the head of a brook then along thos. & that
 goes to Abel to his line to be for his use & at his disposal. Likewise
 I will unto Abel half the meadow as long as he lies on the place
 he now lies on. Likewise as he has one big Bible & all my
 clothes to be for his use. I will to him a winter day during the
 year after his son die of the plantation he now lies on with the
 house & all his line & all the buildings upon water Moses.
 Long having come of age then to be disposed of according to my
 son Moses will except the land & says. Stars / which belong to
 them & Abel. I mean to keep both them & his wood & building timber
 up & given I bequeath unto my daughter Abby to be for her use
 during her life. Likewise my two horses and all my stock of less
 Hogs Sheep & Geese & two feather beds & furniture held my home
 hotel furniture to be for her use & at her disposal, and I will
 & bequeath unto each of my daughters Sarah & Abigail
 both of them to each of them Forty Shillings & the remain-
 der of my money to be for the use of my daughter Abby to
 be for her disposal also my cutting knife to be for her use
 I do will & constitute my son Abel Barnett & John Park for Exec-
 & Trustees of this my last will & testament to see this my last will
 & testament to be performed & carried these presents be-
 fore the Notary Public for the County of Mecklenburg in

to him or anyone at the discretion of my executors & before my death
I leave unto my son Hugh Bennett & his wife Mary Shire & her heirs by
disposal of in the following manner on my death bed entirely
order. That all my first chattels be disposed I shall bequeath
unto my son Hugh Bennett the plantation he now lives on
with the rest of the plantation I now live on beginning on Dandoy
line on a forked Hickey up the plantation from thence a straight
line to a white oak tree by the right hand through the old field
to a pasture on the head of a brook there along thence to that
goes to Nelly to his love to be for his use & at his disposal. Likewise
I will unto Abel Buff the meadow as long as he lives on the place
he now lives on. Likewise another horse & my big Bible & all my
clothes to be for his use. — I will keep unto my daughter Mary the
large clutter room in one of the plantations you live on with the
house & stable there & all the brick Dings thereon until she is
long past 20 years of age then to be disposed of according to my
son Moses will except the brick Dings thereon belonging to
them & Abel Tombs to support them by his wood & building timber
if required I bequeath unto my Daughter Mary to keep her use
during her life, likewise my two horses and all my stock of cows
hogs sheep & geese & two feather beds & furniture & all my house
hold furniture to be for her use & at her disposal, but I will
bequeath unto each of my Daughters Sarah & Whister &
Nellie & Whister to each of them Forty Shillings & the remainder
due of my money to be for the use of my Daughter Mary &
it has also been done my cutting knife to be for her use
I do will & constitute my son Abel Bennett & John Park for Execs.
& Trustees of this my last will & testament to be this my last will
testament executed in witness whereof I have hereunto set
hand this 16th day of November in the year of our Lord 1798.
