

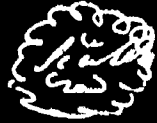

In the name of God Amen, I Hugh Walker of
the County of Mecklenburg & State of N^c Carolina
being at this time perfectly sound in mind & memory
though in a low state of bodily health, do make
this my last will & Testament as follows viz
First I will & bequeath unto my loving wife Peggy
Walker all my Estate real & personal except so
much as she may deem proper for the purpose of
paying all my just debts, then the Residue to
remain in her possession during her widowhood
or natural life for the purpose of being her support
& raising & schooling my children - Second I Will
that Real Estate upon be Equally divided among
my children when the same at mature age
4th If my widow should think proper to marry
then she shall & share alike with my children
5th I Will & allow my wife the sole right to execute

This my last will & Testament as to appoint whom
 I soever shall please to do it, I do sign seal & publish
 this as my last will & Testament in Revocation of all
 others—Signed acknowledged & published
 in presence of .. Oct 19th 1818.

In the name of God Amen, I James Wilson of the County
 of Mecklenburg & State of N. Carolina being of sound &
 disposing mind & memory & calling to mind the mortality
 of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men
 once to die, Do make & declare this my last will and
 Testament as follows Viz all my debts to be paid—
First I recommend my soul to God who gave it, & my body
 to be buried in a decent Christian like manner and as
 to my worldly Estate, I leave & dispose of it in the fol-
 -lowing manner Viz I give & bequeath to my nephew
Ben^d William Wilson the use of all my lands (except a
 part known as my new entry which I do dispose
 of below) during his life time, also my negro fellow
 named George, my negro woman named Peggy & her three
 children together with all her offspring my bed &c &c
 I now lay on & furniture my household & the other
 furniture, my other bed excepted.— I give & bequeath
 to my friend James Wilson Jun^r now in America
 my negro woman named Phebe, my negro girl
 named Sophia & bed & furniture & that part of my
