

In the name of God amen, I Humphrey Hunter of the County of North
 Carolina being thro' the abundant mercy and
 goodness of God, tho' weak in body yet of sound & perfect understand-
 ing & memory do constitute this my last will & Testament & desire it
 may be revised by all as such, First I most Humbly begreat my
 soul to God my maker beseeching his most gracious acceptance
 of it through the Merits of Jesus Christ, I give my body, to the earth
 from whence it was taken in full assurance of its resurrection
 from thence at the last day, as for my burial. I desire it may
 be decent at the discretion of my dear wife & my Executors
 hereafter named; as to my worldly estate I will & positively Order
 that all my just debts be paid; I give & bequeath to my beloved
 wife one black mare together with her saddle & Bridle & to the one
 then milke Cow for herself out of my Cattle & one Beep & four
 sheep that she may chase & liken in three years to cows &
 one sow & the whole of the given, liken in one bed & furniture
 together with the whole of the household furniture of other kind
 & to have the care of the lands on which I now live to raise the
 Children & to be supported off said land herself during her natural
 life or her Dowry & that my lands be equally divided between
 my two sons Elam & Henry George. I give & bequeath to my daughter
 the Rising one bed & furniture & the remainder of my property
 to be sold at Vendue as soon as may be convenient after my death
 & to be Equally divided between my three children that are now
 & the one that my wife is now pregnant with & if that is a boy
 that then the other two boys pay to him out of the value of the
 Land what may make them equal shares, as for my farming
 utensils I leave them for the use of the plantation, & I likewise
 Order that the plantation be not parted out of the hands of my wife
 & Children so as it may be exposed to damage.

And I do constitute & appoint my father Henry Hunter & my wife
 Margaret Hunter Executors of this my last will & Testament, confirm-
 ing & acknowledging this & no other as my last will & Testament
 in witness whereof I hereunto set my hand & seal this 25 day of
 July in the year of our Lord 1804 -

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three Milah Cows for herself out of my Cattle & one Beef & four
sheep that she may choose & likewise three younger Barrows &
one Sow & the whole of the Give, likewise one bed & furniture
together with the whole of the household furniture of other kind
