& above his Schooling up so much in remaining of my estate
and the rest of my estate I order to be put to publick sale
and the money arising there from to be equally to be divided
among my brothers & sisters and my clothes I leave at the
discretions of my Executress.

Lastly I do ordain & appoint my well beloved wife Eleanor & my
dearly friend Jacobus Wilson to be the sole Executress of this
my last will & testament & to see that it be performed according
to the true intent & meaning hereof and I do hereby renounce
all counseil & advice given me by any person or persons

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which I declare this no other to be my last will & testament.

and ordain & appoint this to be my last will & testament in

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And then all my debts & funeral charges to be paid out of my Estates by my executors here at the mentioned.... Again.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Andrew Lathay son Alexander & the Negro Wench called Sylvia as my son who died had directed in his life time, provided he pay twenty pounds in Money that is to say one sixth part to my son John Lathay one sixth part to my son Andrew Lathay, one sixth part to my son George Lathay, one sixth part to my Grandson John Tool & Elizabeth Williams, one sixth part to Thomas Lathay Branley & Anderson Wallace to be equally divided between them & one sixth part to Joseph McGoan & Hugh McGoan Equally divided between them —

Item I give & bequeath to my son John Lathay son Andrew & the Negro Wench called Sylvia he paying the sum of forty pounds, that is to say one sixth part to be paid to my son John & a sixth part to my son Andrew, one sixth part to my son George Lathay & one sixth part to Thomas Lathay Branley & Anderson Wallace, & one sixth part

to John Tool & Elizabeth Williams, & one sixth part to Joseph

McGoan & Hugh McGoan — Item I give & bequeath to my son George Lathay son George the Negro Wench called Rachel, provided he pay the sum of Twenty pounds, that is to say to my son John one sixth part to my son Andrew one sixth part to my sons George one sixth part, and one sixth part to John Tool & Elizabeth Williams & the other sixth part to Thomas Lathay Branley and Andrew Anderson Wallace & the other sixth part to Joseph & Hugh McGoan, and all the rest of my worldly goods to be equally divided in six shares between my son John one sixth to my son Andrew one sixth & my son George one sixth part, & one sixth part to John Tool & Elizabeth Williams, one sixth to Thomas Lathay Branley & Andrew Anderson Wallace, one sixth part to Joseph and Hugh McGoan except my brother Bed & furniture I leave and bequeath to Mary John Chambers, and all my dear Brother I. too divided between my two daughters to wit Eleanor Williams & Eliza McGoan & also I give & bequeath to Alexander Long & Joseph Chambers one year old son of fifty, lived in base w/ the wife of Thomas Branley & Andrew Anderson Wallace both deceased

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giving the Negro Wench called Sylva as my son Christopher
had directed in his lifetime, provided he pay twenty pounds
in money that is to say one sixth part to my son John Estes
one sixth part to my son Andrew Estes, one sixth part
to my son George Estes, one sixth part to my Grandson
John Tool, & Elizabeth Williams, one sixth part to Thomas
Estes Bransby & Andrew Anderson Wallace to be equally
divided between them, & one sixth part to Joseph M'Gowen
& Hugh M'Gowen equally divided between them —

Then I give & bequeath to my son John Estes son Christopher Estes
the Negro Wench called Sylva be paying the sum of forty pounds, that is
to say one sixth part to be paid to my son John & a sixth part to my
son Andrew, one sixth part to my son George Estes & one sixth part to
Thomas Estes Bransby & Andrew Anderson Wallace, & one sixth part
to John Tool & Elizabeth Williams, & one sixth part to Joseph
M'Gowen & Hugh M'Gowen — Then I give & bequeath to my son George
Estes son George the Negro Wench called Rachel, provided he
pay the sum of Twenty pounds, that is to say to my son John

divided between my two daughters to next Eleanor Williams
& Esther M'Gowen & also I give & bequeath to Alexander Long &
Joseph Chambers one year old servt fifty. bind in law as
Thomas Estes Bransby & Andrew Anderson Wallace both die &
before they come to age then & in that case their part is to be
divided between John Tool & Elizabeth Williams on her
& Joseph & Hugh M'Gowen the other half — And Lastly I do

now, & do, refuse & Desannul all wills heretofore made by
 me, and do now constitute Ordain & declare this & this only to be my
 Last Will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand & affixed my seal this ninth day of March 1777
 NB And I do appoint my Trusty & dear son Geo. Estes
 & Robert Lewis to be my whole & sole Executors of this my last
 Will & Testament, and also I give & bequeath to my Daughter
 Eleanor Williams a certain Due sum with out hours all to
 which I have set my hand & seal the day & year above written
 signed sealed & declared

in the presence of us.

22 To all Christian people whom these presents may concern
 Know ye that I John Brown being in a weakly state of body but
 of sound mind ^{Mecklenburg Co. NC Wills 1783-1844} ^{and memory failing to know the Mortality of my}
^{body} & that it is expected for all men once to die, I do
 therefore make this my last Will & Testament Viz I command
 my soul to God who gave it & my body to be buried in a
 Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors, & as
 something back worldly Estate as God hath helped me with
 I will give & dispose of the same in the following manner
 and form.

First of all I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Martha in lieu
 of her Dowry one mare called Harry his choice of three Cows
 & all the Sheep with the whole of the grain for the use of
 the family & such like as a sufficiency of meat for her
 & the family with the whole of the House & Kitchen furniture
 including beds & Bedding Chests &c &c with the privilege of
 my Mansion House and all other her as of Office with a
 comfortable Maintenance for her & such Children as may
 live with her during her life or widowhood.

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter Mary with
 the sum of five Shillings
