Item. I give to my dear & loving wife Margaret Carnuth, for term of life the house built upon side saddle & bridge & also her bed & bed clothing, also leave to my dear & loving wife during her widowhood or Disease the land & Government that ly about it wherein I now live and after her death to my only son John Carnuth — I give & bequeath to my son Adam a tract of land containing two hundred acres, settid in his own name lying & being in Tryon County & situated on Indian Creek & also desire that my son make a title of the land I now leave unto my son John Carnuth the small remainder of my estate do constitute executors. Then my executors of this my last will & testament & provide for my wife & children to make present sale of all their necessaries and after my lawful debts are paid the remainder of my estate to be paid to the edifying & relief of my poor children in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 30<sup>th</sup> day of August in the year of our Lord 1775.
