County S. Carolina being of sound mind perfect memory and
memory (Blessed be God) do this fourteenth day of Aug
1821 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and nine make and publish this my last will &
testament in the manner following that is to wit
I recommend my soul to God who gave it - My
body to the earth with a decent funeral at the
direction of my family

As to my worldly estate which it hath pleased
God to bless me with it is my will that it be disposed of
in the manner following (to wit) first that all my
debts be paid by my executors then my negroes
with the value of their teeth be appraised by the court
secondly I will I bequeath to my wife Ann in full of
her dower a decent maintenance on the plantation
which I now live on say the land one acre or more
I occupy & for which I have this 4 a Survey done for
200 acres in all survey for negroes by or well as now
and no longer the said 200 acres of land I will I
bequeath to my two sons John & William to be
equally divided between them & also the 50 acres which
John said came to his father bought of Thomas
Kinney's tract of land in all 200 acres to be divided
by men appointed by Court & sworn they will be
quality & quantity both as to upland bottom land and
meadow it is my will that the said 200 acres
