Item I will I be, next to my son Elias all I desireth the tract of Land whereon I now live, and I also will and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Taylor all I desireth the tract of Land between Frederick Taylor's界 mark & Elton I will & bequeath a tract of Land to my son John now living in the State of Minnesota County, and all the rest of my property such as Horses cattle household furniture plantation tools, Carpenter Tools, &c. I will & bequeath to be sold to be equally divided among my children save one woman's Saddle to be taken out, for my Daughter Mary Taylor to go for the Mecklenburg Co. NC Wills 1783-1844 I print my son John & Samuel Davis. Dated this 3^d of January 1804

In the name of God Amen. I James Barry, being sick & in a low condition, but at the same time enjoy a sound body and mind & memory before God do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following that is to say -

1^o I allow all my just Debts to be paid as soon as possible & my two Bay horses by the name of Bold & Paddy to be sold so to help to pay them.

2^o I give & bequeath to my brother Hugh Morgan one third of my movable property. 3^o I give & bequeath to my son Robert ten Shillings Sterling to my sons Allen, Justin and Henry five Shillings Sterling each & to my son in law Robert Morgan five Shillings Sterling. A willam of mine

- and Alexander Ch'Gatley five Shillings Sterling each.
- 4th I allow the Balance of my Moneyable Posserty to be at the disposal of my wife amongst my Children.
- 5th I leave & bequeath my Land to my two Sons James the Neikson to be equally divided between them.
- 6th I likewise Give & bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret my Gray mare her Saddle & Bridle.
- 7th I hereby make & Ordain my beloved wife Margaret & my Trusty Son Allen Executrix of this my last Will & Testament, In witness whereof I the said James Curry have to this my last Will & Testament set my hand & Seal this 13th day of October 1805 signed & sealed in the presence of

8th In the name of God amen I James Clerk of the County of Mecklenburg State of Carolina, being in a sick & low condition, but of perfect sound mind & memory, thanks to God for the same; Do this 1st Day of June in the Year of our Lord 1807 Do make publish & declare this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following Viz -

- 9th I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Lucy Stock the full use of the one third my plantation on which I live with my Dwelling house & out houses her Natural life & no longer I also give unto my wife Lucy two scattre beds with all their bedding also two under beds & one bedstead, I also give unto my wife Lucy my Stock, fifty four years old with her side Saddle & Bridle, I also give unto my wife Lucy my bed bows & the choice of another out of my Stock -
- 10th I give & bequeath unto my son James Clark all the two thirds of my plantation together with the other third I will to my son at his death to be his share, I further allow my plantation Negroes Stock & farming Utensils to remain as they now are while under the immediate direction of my friend John A. Gray or any of his heirs to have cash for the same value of the property
