

In the Name of God Amen. I James Houston of Bucklandung County
S.P. 1. of No Carolina, being at present weak in body but of a sound and
disposing mind & memory blessed be God. Declaring to make this Mortality of
my life; & that it is apparent for all men once to die. Do make & ordain this
my last Will & Testament in the manner & form following viz. That I by
this of my command may send to God who gave it & my body to the
earth to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the interment
of my ancestors herein after named And as touching the worldly Estate as it
hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of the same as follows
First I Will that my just debts & funeral expenses be paid & discharged as soon
as convenient after my decease. I give the same unto my wife
and wife Jane the plantation I now live on together with the dwelling house
other out buildings thereunto belonging & that of my household. Likewise
I give unto my wife a Negro woman named Hannah two children to her
namely one male of about one hundred & four years old the other
male & ready all the kitchen furniture a grey horse called Brandy a Sorel
mare both two years old her saddle & paces Cows & other beasts & that to her
use & profit. Also I give unto my son James the plantation he now lives
on continuing 112 acres to him this his sonne is for simplicity, likewise his
sons & daughters of the said he now lives on that was formerly purchased from
William Givens. & the plantation I now live on at the decease of his mother
Isabella this his sonne is for simplicity, likewise his wife unto my son
James Houston named Jane. A Negro boy named Africa. Also I give unto my
daughter Agnes wife to John Pitts a Negro woman named Alice & that to her
use of my said daughter until her decease to be given at her pleasure with
the same to her daughters here or there. Yet it is otherwise my will that I be
laid on the bales of timber middle earth adjoining land of Robert Hunter
containing one hundred acres & a half near Buckland. The said land being 50 acres
an entry of 100 acres on Givens's hill and be excepted to his son as soon as
convenient after my decease & the money received for the same to be divided as
soon after my decease & I do hereby command my executors to make a
suit & sufficient a little or more of every year to the purchasers of land
which I myselfe could have done taken personally present. And further
in my will that my Negro man George Wilson my servant named
without all my personal property not herein before mentioned
but all the rest of my personal property

my last Will & Testament in the manner & form following viz. That my
first & last commandment may be to God who gave it to my body is the
same to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the interment
of my deceased person after same shall be touching the worldly estate as it
hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of the same as follows
First I Will that my just debts & funeral expenses be paid & discharged as you
are convenient after my decease I further give the greatest part of my land
unto my wife Anna the plantation I now live on together with the dwelling house
other out buildings thereunto belonging & that of course her self & her
son unto my wife & her son formerly named Hannah Lewis, ~~but~~ ^{now} he is & her
son one mile of dragon one fable & from thence all the spanning
and bridge all the kitchen furniture a grey horse called brandy a Sorel
mule both two years old her saddle & pommel, Cows & other beasts & that John Lewis
my son - Also I leave unto my son James the plantation he now lives
in containing 112 acres to him & his heirs forever to be simple, likewise two
acres adjoining the land he now lives on that was formerly purchased from
William Gibbs, & the plantation I now live on at the decease of his wife then
to him & his heirs forever for simply. Likewise leave unto my son John
Lewis man & land & a negro boy named Africa. Item I leave unto my
daughter wife to John Pitts a negro woman named Anna & that she may
have of my said daughter further disease to be given at her pleasure either
in her neighborhood or house. Yet it is otherwise my will that she
live on the waters of Shute mill creek Adjoining land of Robert Norton
containing one hundred acres & half acre bought little less than 50 acres
an entry of 100 acres on Gibbs's hill and be expected to be given as soon as
convenient after my decease & the money received for the same to be divided as
soon after my decease & I do hereby direct that my executors to make up
and sufficient a little or else of every year to the poor houses of said
village myself to be done when personally present. And further
I give my will that my negro man George & Anna & my two daughters
with all my personal property not herein before mentioned be
left to the sale by my executors as soon as convenient after my
& the money arising thereon to be sold by them to the best price
in my possession & the last standing debt due to me to be given to
my executors. To my wife Anna & her husband to my grand daughter

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Eliza Felt, & Mary H. Nancy Potts, to each of them twenty dollars to begin
their widow life at 18 years of age on the day of their marriage with the
In trust also thereon H. L. Houston, of these three last named children the
two before they are 18 years of age on the day of their marriage \$150.
their share to go the survivors, to my sister Isabella wife to William
Houston the forty dollars, to my Grandson James Houston Harrison, to
to David Houston one hundred dollars, to my Grandson James
Patterson son to John Patterson two hundred dollars to my daughter
Margaret wife to John Patterson one hundred eighty dollars and it is
my will that the money hereby left to my two grandsons be paid to
them at 18 years of age when they arrive to the age of twenty one years
of the remainder of the money residing from the sales thereof apportioned be
equally divided between my four children viz James, a negro,
wife to John Potts, Margaret wife to John Patterson & deceased wife
William Harrison their others alive - And lastly I do hereby
nominate constable & appraiser William Pitt & my son James Houston
Houston & my son in law John Patterson to be the sole executors of
this my last will & testament hereby revoking & making void all
previous wills by me heretofore made. Ratifying & confirming this
my last will & testament in Writing whereof I have countersigned
my hand & affixed my seal this 18th day of January anno Dom. 1800

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Note of which it may appear that James Houston having

should be given at my death to my daughter Isabella wife to William
Harrison, It however is now with my wife & our two negro children not
intended to be sold or given to her now or to be at
her disposing, It however will be the 100 acres of the land that we, son from
our time on which was purchased from Robert Duncum & 150 dollars

their share to go the survivors, to my sister Isabella wife to Willm. Ag
Ami the first child, to my Grandson James Houston Morrison
to Dr. D. Morrison one hundred dollars, to my Grandson James H.
Patterson son to John Patterson two hundred dollars to my daughter
Margaret wife to John Patterson one hundred eighty dollars and it is
by will that the money having left to my two grandsons be paid to
Interest & paid to them when they come to the age of twenty one years
of the remainder of the Morris landing from the sale of his interest be
equally divided between my four children viz James, my wife,

her disposing. She has got the 1700 acres of the land that is, some
new lines on which was purchased, born Robert Decatur & 150 acres
the land adjoining that was purchased from William Pitt's executors
lands of H Houston to be apportioned, public sale by my executors as soon
convenient after my decease & the money arising from such sale to
equally divide between my four children viz James, my wife~~

John Potts, Margaret wife, & John Patterson & his son and wife to his son
Henry, their & their children, & I do hereby Ruthenize my executors or any
one of them, to make as good a title or deed of conveyance to the proprietors
of said lands as I myself could have done were personally present, & it is
my will that my son James have the one hundred & fifty acres of land the
remainder of the 300 acres purchased from Mr. Givens & the plantation known
him at his mothers death to him & his heirs forever in fee simple. In witness
