


as may be upon the copy be made, and after my just debts

 will & Testament which I now publish & declare to be so.  
 I revoke all other wills heretofore by me made this 18<sup>th</sup>  
 day of March 1817 —

In the name of God Amen I James Johnston of the County of  
 Horry & State of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina being at this time blessed  
 by God for it, in a sound State of mind & memory & in a reasonable  
 State of health of body, but calling to mind my mortality &  
 that it is appointed by an Eternal decree of Heaven for all  
 men once to die; Do make this my last will & Testament in  
 manner following that is to say, I will that my body be  
 decently interred or buried, — & that all my just debts, be paid  
 out of what worldly estate with which God hath blessed me &  
 will the following distribution — I will & bequeath unto my  
 niece Polly Jamison Twenty dollars — Next I will & bequeath  
 unto his daughter Rachel Jamison my loom with all her Tools  
 — Next I will & bequeath unto my Niece Jerry leaving  
 my Walnut Chest, I also will & allow to my son James  
 the price of my mare & saddle with the harness  
 — & if there are until he is of full age, which property I  
 allow to be put to sale immediately after my decease  
 I will & allow my niece Rachel Johnston thirty dollars  
 & my looking glass, & I will & bequeath unto my  
 nephew Thomas Johnston my negro boy Abram & my silver  
 watch also my spurs & Tacklings, and I will & allow my

Yephew William Johnson one Dollar - I will and  
 bequeath unto my Sister Molly Jamison one Dollar  
 I will allow my Nephew William & John Jamison  
 one dollar each, and I will allow my Niece Peggy Ramsey  
 one Dollar, I allow my Sister in law Rachel Johnson my  
best flax hackle & the price of a gown of her own choosing  
 Next I will that my Executor immediately put to public  
 sale the residue of my Effects not bequeathed in order to enable  
 him to fulfil this will & if any balance over I allow it  
 to my Nephew Thomas Johnson. And I do hereby  
 appoint & Ordain David McDonald Sole Executor of this my  
 last Will & Testament. Which I now sign seal publish  
 & declare in the presence of August 13<sup>th</sup> 1816

In the name of God Amen. I Petitioner James of the State of  
 Carolina & back to my County, on account of Twelve mile creek  
 being at present much afflicted with the pain & weakness  
 of a second discharging mind bequeathed by God, finding I can  
 not long remain in the body Do make & declare this my  
 last Will & Testament in manner & form following  
 I bequeath those given of my life, leaving my departing soul into  
 my hands I commit my Spirit to him. My body is from  
 the earth & must return to the same. It is therefore my wish  
 that it be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at  
 the direction of my Executors to be named herein after.  
 And as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to  
 bless me with, I give & dispose of the same as follows  
 First I will that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid  
 as soon as convenient after my decease; secondly I will & bequeath  
 to each & all of my children not where I have at any time  
 given to any or all of them previous to my decease, and that  
 no demands be made on any of them for debts which may be  
 supposed due to me. Thirdly, I give & bequeath to each of my
