I James Linn of Marlboro County & Carolina being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory & sound judgment, knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last Will & Testament desiring it may be known by all as such, first I give my soul to my maker & my body to the earth from whence it was taken in full assurance of its resurrection at the last day. Item the Almighty power of God my maker, I desire that my just debts & funeral expenses be first paid, & as for my lawfully estate which it hath pleased God to bless me with I will divide as follows (viz) Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son James Linn one hundred & fifty acres of Land joining the land of Hector Hester's wife on the west side of six mile creek to him his heirs & assigns forever. Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son John Linn one hundred & fifty acres of Land joining James Parton's land on the east side of six mile creek the creek being the line between him & his son James to him his heirs & assigns forever. Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son Gallie Linn one hundred & one hundred & fifty acres of land joining & between his brother James & the wagon road to his & his heirs & assigns forever. Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son William Miller Linn one hundred & twenty acres of land including my dwelling house & improvements to him his heirs & assigns forever. Item I give & bequeath to my beloved wife one week a natural pair of hounds to hunt, I have two white hounds & a small black one for the use of hunting the plantation for the maintenance of the family. Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son James Linn one bay mare & colt which was heretofore call'd His property. Item it is my desire that my beloved wife have the dwelling house & furniture where I now live during her widowhood for the support of the family & likewise her plantation tools shall be thought sufficient by my executors to carry on the plantation business. Item it is my will that my wheelwright tools & Smith Tools be divided among my sons so as my executors in their discretion shall think best. Item I give & bequeath to my beloved children Eleanor Linn, James Linn, John Linn, Sophia Linn, Gallie Linn, William Linn, Prudence Linn each one a cow or a heifer as my executors thinks best, and the rest of my little furniture.

forever — Then I give & bequeath to my beloved wife one Mule a Natural  
of a Brown color, I have two white horses & a small black mare for the  
use of working the plantation for the maintenance of the family —

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son James Linn one bay Mare &  
Calf which was heretofore call'd his property — Then it is my desire  
that my beloved wife have the dwelling house & furniture where  
I now live during her widowhood for the support of the family &  
whatever her plantation tools shall be thought sufficient by my  
executors to carry on the plantation business — Then it is my will that  
my Wheelwright Tools & Smith Tools be divided among my sons  
as my executors in their discretion shall think best — Then I give &  
bequeath to my beloved children Eleanor Linn, James Linn, John Linn,  
Agape Linn, Callie Linn, William Linn, Prudence Linn each one  
a Cow or a Kippe as my executors thinks best, and the rest of my cattle  
to be disposed of for the use of my family — Then I give & bequeath to my  
beloved daughter Elizabeth Linn her bed & other articles which is now  
called her property — Then I give to my beloved daughter Catherine  
Gillespie five Shillings — Then I give & bequeath to my beloved  
Daughters Margaret Wallace, Mary Parton & Jane Richardson

Each pair Shillings. And all the rest of my Estates to be Equally  
divided as my Executors thinks proper, and I hereby appoint my  
beloved Wife Sarah Liver & James Paxton as my Executors. Given

in the State of Massachusetts being very sick & weak in body but of perfect  
mind & memory than his be given unto God. Calling unto mind the  
mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once  
to die, Do make & ordain this my last will & Testament that is to say  
Principally of all I give & recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty  
God that gave it, my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in  
a decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors, nothing  
doubting but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same of  
by the mighty power of God; And as touching such worldly Estate wher  
with it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, Devise & dispose  
of the same in the following manner & form first. I give & bequeath  
to Catherine my dearly beloved wife that part of my dwelling house  
& on the plantation whereon I now live which is commonly called  
the new house with fire room in the old house, that she may enjoy the  
same to her only proper use to the end of her life) my plantation contain  
ing one hundred & eighty acres of Deeded Land shall after my death be sold  
by way of Public Vendue & a lawful Deed is to be given to the purchaser  
thereof by which deed shall be excepted the above dwelling house, for  
the Dower of my said wife. On that day the place shall be liable  
besides the Execution already mentioned to accomplish himself to the  
following articles during the natural life time of my said wife eight  
bushels of the plantation shall find & provide for my said wife eight  
barrels sufficient firewood which he on his own costs shall carry to  
her dwelling house fit to burn further he shall give to my said wife  
per annum fifteen bushels of God & Earthly wheat, four bushels of  
1 & 1/2 lbs of one hundred & fifty weight & Sixty pounds weight of good  
Monthly eighteen eggs, and further my
