

✓ In the Name of God Amen, This 13th day of May 1769 I Joseph Moore
of the Northampton County being very sick & weak in body, but of a full
mind & memory, Thanks be given unto God therefore, calling unto mind the
mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
die, I have made & declare this my last will & Testament, that is to say
Principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul unto the hand of
almighty God that gave it, & my body I recommend to the earth to be
buried in a decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors
nothing else they but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the mighty power of God; And as touching such worldly
estate which with it has pleased God to bestow in this life, I give, devise
& dispose of the same in the following manner & form. First I give &
bequeath the late Mary my dearly beloved wife to have her maintenance
out of what I own more at present, & her choice of any of the best, that
she thinks proper as long as she lives & the rest I leave to my well beloved
son Joseph Moore to take care of his mother while she is alive. Except one
pound & half & one shilling I leave to my daughter Ann Lemon, also to my
to my well beloved son to whom I likewise constitute make & make
my sole Executor of this my last will & Testament. And I do hereby utterly
disallow, Revoke & disannul all & every other former Testament, Will,
Bequest, bequests Executions by me in any wise before named, written &
bequested, Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will &
Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the
day & year above written. Signed sealed published pronounced and
delivered to the said Joseph Moore as his last will & Testament in the
presence of us the subscribers hereto present

In the Name of God Amen, I James H. Givins being weak of body, but
perfect mind & memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die, I have made & declare
this my last will & Testament. And first I do recommend my soul unto God
who gave it & my body to be buried in a decent manner at the

desires of my Executors And as touching such worldly goods as
hath pleased God to bestow on me with I dispose of them in the following
manner & form. Imprimis I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife
Elizabeth one fourth part of my possessions, her saddle & the whole of all
my moveable estate after my just debts are paid. & the privilege of
living on & enjoying all the profits of this plantation on which
I now live until my son Thomas arrives at the age of twenty one
Then I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Thomas when he
arrives at the age of twenty one the one half of the plantation on which
I now live. Then I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son John when
he arrives at the age of twenty one years the remaining half of this
plantation on which I now live. These I have given & reason to believe
that my beloved wife Elizabeth is now pregnant with the child & if it
should please God to preserve it till it arrives to the age of twenty one
years if a son I will that my two sons Thomas & John pay unto
him the third part of whatever share the above said plantation may
be valued to be in different men & houses that before when my
son Thomas enters on his part but if a daughter I will that when
she arrives at the age of twenty one years that they pay unto her share
be it less than the third part of said valuation. If it so hap-
pened that God to remove by death any of my said children before they
arrive at full age that it is my will that the survivors or survivors
enjoy their part or if a daughter the proportional part as above
And lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint my Honoured & well beloved
son my beloved wife Elizabeth to be my whole & sole Executors of this my
last will & Testament, hereby revoking all other wills, Notifying & confirming
this as my last will & Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & affixed my seal this first day of October in the year of our Lord 1774
