as possible after my decease.

2^a As to the remainder of my property after my debts are paid it
is my will that I be disposed of as follows. To my beloved wife
Ann McKnight I will & bequeath my Negro woman Pug, my
negro boy Jeff, my negro girl Nancy Malinda also my boy now
named Henry, my riding Gig her saddle & bridle two books with
pen tables for writing her choices two pairs of bales one Bureau
I own & I bequeath to my Son Henry which may carry her name
in perpetuity. She has the privilege of my dwelling house
and other out buildings with the use of all the household
furniture, utensils for herself & family so long as they remain
in a family capacity or the remains in her widowhood.

3^a To my beloved son David McKnight I bequeath together
with the lot or parcel of land I have already deeded to him
my negro boy Sandy & Henry, also one son called Danie
which he is in possession of, also iron bars now at his disposal
also my single Triggered Rifle gun, together with whatsoever
other articles I may have heretofore given him. To my
grandson James McKnight son of Daniel I give and
bequeath my negro boy Abram my above Considered
as his first share of my estate at this time.

4^a To my beloved James McKnight I give & bequeath him I do
hereby give all that lot or parcel of ground, except of the
present dwelling on said bounded as follows viz Beginning
on the west bank of big sugar creek at the mouth of the stream,
so much thereof with said branch east, both opposite to the negro
grave yard. Thereon with the south side of said branch to the
line in a curve as run on yesterday by Mr. Herren as a Black
Patch near the road leading to Hight Mill creek, then with the
Hill to the river line, thereon with the said Hight Mill creek line to
McDonalds corner on pine hill, thereon in my chain line to the

my negro boys Charles, Bob & Jack one horse named Howard
my waggon & gears, also my plantation Waggon. my other
sons to have the use of the waggon when needed until they
become sufficiently worth to afford of these among said my double
hinged Hause gears, till my farm my slaves my Finch Farm
my other sons to have the use of when needed my grindstone
my bed alreadt bedded and one bed & suitable furniture

spinning wheel & carder to make her in these respects, to be
as fine as my sister -

I will and desire that my negro woman Letty be & remain
with my wife & family on the plantation to the date we and

go together with whatever articles of property I may have given him hereto
To my beloved son William McKnight I give & bequeath the sum
One hundred pounds all the remainder of my funds & having first paid
of my plantation now lies on the land where my mansion house
stands, subject to the encumbrance of his mother I do, but while
they remain in a family capacity that is to say so long as his
mother remains a widow and his sister unmarried also
my negro boy Charles, Bob & Jack one horse named Horse
my waggon 8 years, also my plantation Waggon, my other
one to have the use of the waggon when needed until they
become supplied with waggons of their own, and my double

my other sons to have the use of them needed, my Groundstone

one graining barrel & boards for bedding and other horses harnessed
hitching, mucking & equal to her brother Nancy Price -

To my beloved Daughter Mary A. McKnight I will & bequeath
my negro girl named Hannah boy Joe & girl Emily Grace & Martha
one horse saddle & bridle worth eight dollars, one iron scuttle
bedding & other furniture to make her in these respects, to be
like my other sisters -

I will and desire that my negro woman Letty be & remain
with my wife & family on the plantation to the sole use and
benefit of my wife & family that remain in a family capacity
and at the death of my said wife (or in case she should marry)
and cease to be my property. I will & desire that the said negro

Woman fully & in open Shew to the have my last will & Testament
written among my Husbands or their lawful Representatives
Shew and shew like either by sale or Valuation as my
executors may think proper.

What ever Stock of Provision, Grain, feeded &c may be
on hand at the time of my decease, also the Crop that may
be then growing it long after the live Stock &c. with
above I desire & allow for the benefit of my Family that
may be then living in a family Majority or the promise
I desire that my large family Bible remain in the house
my other Books to be equally divided my Children.

My wearing Apparel I desire to be divided among my Son
as my beloved wife may think proper.

As it is not contemplated by me that there be any sale of
my property having willed it as far as present as
possible, Should it so turn out that there be any sale
not disposed of above, my wife that they remain on the
promise to the ~~best~~ ^{benefit} of my family the same.

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I do hereby constitute & appoint my
Son Daniel McKnight as my Brother in Law David McMurtry
the Executrix of this my last will & Testament, and I do hereby
revoke & disannul all other wills, by me heretofore made
or published, Declaring this one other to be my last will
and Testament In witness whereof I the said James
McKnight have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this 10th day of October 1826.
