Revoking all others. And first I Will & ordain that my funeral
expenses & just debts be paid in some convenient time after
my decease from the sale of my slaves Tillah & her issue &
debts owing to me & the produce of my farm by my executors
hereafter named. I Will & bequeath to my beloved wife Ruth
Porter & her legal bodyly Heirs the following Slaves namely Rhode
the last Sophie & Dolly, also all the Household & Kitchen furniture
only what is hereafter excepted the comfortable Maintenance
in this my dwelling house with every accommodation
to supply her personal wants during her widowhood, her
own Slaves continuing to be employed as heretofore, also one
Stock of Sheep. I Will & bequeath to my son William B.
Porter one hundred dollars having at his settling given him
upwards of Two Thousand dollars worth of real property at that
time now worth double that sum which is much more
than I can well give any other child, I also give my son body
clothes my cattle & tools. I Will & give my daughter

Mary I command & her bodily Hires the following named
Slaves. Hannah, Henry & Violet should my said daughter
die without leaving any bodily issue, then it is my will
that Hannah descend to my son in law James Cromwell; that
Henry descend to my son James S Porter & Violet to my
daughter Margaret J. Porter & their heirs. I Will & bequeath
to my son James S Porter & his Heirs the following Slaves
Sampson, Scot, Leona & Edmund to him & his Heirs a good
feast bed &c — I Will & bequeath to my son John S Porter
& his Heirs the tract of land on which I now live with all
pertaining thereto with all the furniture in my writing
room separately bequeathed by me in the transaction of all
my home business with the uninterrupted possession & occu-
pancy of the said room, also my legal & earthly Slave Jack
& Samuel Solomon. Also my Stock of Horses, Cattle & Hogs all the
farming implements of every description including my Waggon
& gears in trust for the support & accommodation of my family
now with me. My Hall room furniture for the same purpose
as are & every article or article not mentioned in this will
I conclude that my said John S pay the then remaining
balance, of ready just debts, & such other encumbrances as
are inserted in my will — I Will & bequeath to my daughter
Margaret J. Porter & her Heirs the following Slaves namely Feb
Charlotte, Harriet, Alexander & Stephen, my Servt were named Pidge
one worth one hundred dollars, a good saddle & bridle —
one good feather bed with bought curtains & good furniture
with all necessary Clothing & a Gentleman's maintenance in this city
in the uninterrupted occupancy of the large room with a fire
place up stairs & free intercourse as heretofore, while she may
remain single her slaves to be kept & employed as heretofore
to my grand daughter Eliza Reizel Hollingshead Lewis, I recognoze to
confer to her all the property derived by her from her Reizel H.
Lewis, deceased & will more fully appear in detail by affidavit
being back to the annexed instrument of Writing confirmed & signed
by myself & Joseph Lewis dated the 22^d day of October in the year

that Hannah deeded to my son in law James Cromartie, that
Henry deeded to my son James S. Porter & Violet to my
daughter Margaret S. Porter & their Heirs. I Will & bequeath

Porter Executors of this my last Will & Testament, In witness

An inventory in detail of the several articles included in the above described as far as it respects the child which it is agreed shall hereafter be Baptized & known by the name Mary Hugie Margaret Lewis, first for name, then, as within detailed preceding, 2^d her Bureau or Box of drawers, 3^o one Seating Fobbin, 4^o her bed & furniture consisting of a Stand of Bright Polished Brass, one Box in & 4 Pillows striped lined two sheets a Flannel & Linen linens & one L.C. Woman Linen sheet two pettled Quilts & pillows Nigh on under bed, one bolstered, her body clothes consisting of two silk dresses, two white drapery, one lace & one finger work, one silk Hand Towel in Sheet, three pairs of stockings one pair of Stockings two stockings, three pair rings & bracelets, two necking hair bands two silver bangles, one ring with the letter G, two pins, cap & pocket, two fans.

Elizabeth H. P. Lewis late died at different times previous
to her death express'd a desire that her property which
she was possessed of previous to her marriage should be divided

and said she left my dear husband Joseph Lewis to retain for his
own use the House & all the bed & furniture there of designat'd
as now my husband's bed, & appointed out to him, also the kitchen
furniture at his discretion, & which infant & only
consists in a great number of pieces of furniture, a bed & furniture which
was painted out her chest of drawers, her sewing table, her bed
etc. also, Yer. Holy Bible & the other books which expressly desired me
to be left with Mr. Lewis said property to be removed to her Brother
Henry there to be taken due care of & measured for the use of her
children, committing the care & execution of her dead infant to the
Mr. H. S. Stiles, she also distinctly made known, that she left her
silver plate before it arrived to mature years with the property
allowed to her to give to her Sister Margaret J. Porter -
Know know ye that we James Porter father of the above Joseph Lewis has
had of the late H. H. Stevens executors for \$100 in consideration of
the debt I owe regard we had kept secret, entertain for the use
of my wife & myself leaving child & wife, & in order to
pay off her debts & discharge the solemn injurys from infidelity
in dying gifts - We do in behalf of ourselves & our heirs executors
& administrators & executors of us & them, agree to, require in, & stipulate
to confirm the above disposal of property as those desired to
be paid off, & we do hereby for ourselves & our heirs executors
& administrators, without reserve confirm the same as above
desiring, that in her last will of we have bequeath'd all her lands & effects
to me, & to the wife of the year of our Lord 1817 -

bound of the sum of £ 1000 to be paid for & in consideration of
the well known regard we hold & yet do, entertain for the memory
of our dear departed having child & wife, & in order to
fulfill her desire & discharge the solemn injunctions expressed by
her dying lips - We do in behalf of ourselves and their executors
or Administrators & executors of us & them, agree to, require in, & certify,
that upon the above disposal of property as those desired to
be painted and to be sold hereby for ourselves and their executors
& Administrators, without reserve confirm the same as above
desire. In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands & affec-
