William & John. Seventh I will & bequeath to Charles S. Taylor
my plantation in the Indian land joining William White
land that I purchased from said White & a horse worth Eighty
Dollars & two head of horned cattle & two head of sheep.

Eighth It is my will that my Wagon, Hares & two horses be kept for the
use of the plantation, I also allow the Negroes Sampson & Rich. be
kept on the plantation for the use thereof until my son William
arrives of age & the residue of my property not herein specially
bequeathed I allow to be sold at public auction, & the money
arising from the same to be equally divided among my wife
& children. And Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my
friend William Potts & Benjamin Harrison to the execution of
this my last will & Testament; And I do hereby revoke all
other wills or Wills by me heretofore made, Resolving this to
be my last will & Testament. In Testimony
whereof I the said James Potts hereunto set my hand
& seal this 10th day of July A.D. 1821.
