Peeb son of the late Mr. Wilson & the County of Wethers-  
field. Being of sound mind & memory, blessed be God for his mercies  
do on this 7<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our Lord 1803 make  
My will & this to be my last will & testament in manner and  
form, following. Where first it is my will & desire that the plantation  
whereon I now live be equally divided between my beloved sons  
James Peeb & John Peeb by a straight line running from the meadow  
brook to Harper's manor leaving the lower part to my son James  
& the upper part to my son John to them & their Heirs forever —  
And it is my desire that the said land be sold off & divided by  
my executors which shall be named hereafter, how it is further my  
will that my library appear be equally divided between my said two  
2<sup>d</sup> I give & bequeath to my son James my large house library  
3<sup>d</sup> I give & bequeath to my son John my book intitled Lamb's  
Præaching to Jesus; 4<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter  
Catherine Black one negro girl named Penelope 5<sup>th</sup> I give &  
bequeath to my beloved daughter Martha Duckworth one negro  
girl named Lucy; 6<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter  
Anna Peeb one negro Woman named Rhode also my bed & bedding  
with all the furniture belonging to said bed, also one chest of  
drawers & all the furniture were that is in the house belonging to  
me also one young boy more than years old just or twenty four  
pounds in money to be at her choice which she will take —  
And it is further my will that the remainder of my negro slaves  
& other property be sold, my funeral expenses to just debts paid so  
that any remainder should be it is my will & desire that it be  
equally divided between my two children W. James Peeb, John Peeb  
Catherine Black, Martha Duckworth and Anna Peeb —

And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my trusty friends  
James Wilson & Sonathan Potts & Andrew Henry executors of this  
my last will & testament & no other than the said James Wilson  
Jonathan Potts & Andrew Henry I do hereby make & declare all  
other & former wills & testaments by me made or done, making this  
only to be my last will & testament, the witness whereof I the said  
James Peet have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal the day  
and year above written —

In the name of God amen. This 5<sup>th</sup> day of March  
in the year of our Lord 1804 I Mathew Peet of the County of  
Rockingham in the State of North Carolina, being old & feeble in years  
& failing to mind my mortality & that it is apparent for all men  
to die. Do make this my last will & testament: First & recommending  
my soul to God who gave it, my body to the earth to be buried in  
a decent manner, and as to my worldly estate it is my will & desire  
that all my just debts & general expenses be paid & satisfied by my  
executors hereafter named — I give & be my wife my  
dwelling house with all the furniture thereon & the plantation on  
which said house stands with stock of every kind during her life  
detained or at least until my son John comes to the age of twenty  
one years, but it is my will & order that all things be kept together  
for the use of said family until the said John arrives to the above  
mention'd age, then all moveable property be put to sale & equally  
divided between my wife the above named John, Jordan Elizabeth  
excepting what money well be hereafter mentioned, I give & be my wife  
to my son John when he arrives to the age of 21 years the plan-  
tation on which I now live containing 122 acres upon which will  
agree with the time following his age on which he shall marry some  
other woman from whom he may receive his head & spirit forever.
