weak in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory do make
this will this day in the year of our Lord 1818 in the town of
Charlotte in the County of Mecklenburg in the State of N Carolina
I will direct my heirs & executors to all just debts be paid
& the remainder of my estate be disposed of in the following
manner — I will bequeath to my respective friends
Col^t Thomas J Green all articles of household furniture my
sidde & chair. To my Hon^d Father Francis Pringle
I will bequeath my watch & all my wearing apparel.
To the Associate congregation of Steel Creek I give & bequeath
my library to the use & benefit of the Pastoral Library of
said congregation to be preserved under Subject to the rules
& regulations adopted for the preservation & regulation of
said pastoral library. — To the Beneficent Society of Steel Creek
I bequeath one set of lessons for Sunday Schools & after the
above items of my will are executed there be any remainder
of cash on hand I will direct it to be paid over to the
Treasurer of the Associate Presbytery of the Carolinas to be
disposed of to such persons uses as they may direct.
To my friend Alexander Green I give & bequeath my case of
Mathematical instruments as a token of my friendship for
him — And if there be any other articles not specially men-
tioned in my will it is that they be given to my friend Col^t Thomas
J Green — I will & positively by this that all my books &
papers of literary correspondence or otherwise be burnt
without being read which lastly I wish, apparent my
finely bound Thucydides from Col^t Horner & his collection
of them my last will & testament, history, writing &c &c
will be made in the Will of the late Mr. Wm. W. H. of whom he was to take my
hand & seal the 22^d day of October 1818
Signed sealed published & declared by the Revd James
James Pringle to be his last will in the presence
of all who have witnessed & subscribed the same
as two witness in the presence of the Testator.

With in every best effort & perfect mind & memory, Do make
publick the very last will in manner & form following viz
I will that my house & all my estate shall just debts be paid.
& the remainder be disposed of in the following
manner — I will bequeath to my respective friends
John Thomas & Green all articles of Household furniture my
sidde & brother To my son & Father Francis Dringle
I will begin with my watch & all my horing appurts.
To the Associate congregation of Saint Creek I give \$60, worth
my library to the use & benefit of the Pastoral Library of
said congregation to be preserved under & subject to the rules
& regulations adopted for the preservation & regulation of
said pastoral library. — To the Beneficent Society of Saint Creek
I bequeath one set of lessons for Sunday Schools. If after the
above items of my will are executed, there be any remainder
of cash on hand I will & direct it to be paid over to the
treasurer of the Associate Presbytery of the Carolinas to be
disposed of to such pious uses as they may direct.
To my friend Alexander Green I give & bequeath my case of
Mathematical instruments as a token of my friendship for
him — And if there be any other articles not specially men-
tioned above my will is that they be given to my friend Col. the Rev'd
J Green — I will & positively by express that all my p. i. to
papers of literary correspondence or otherwise be burnt
without being read which lastly I intend, apparent my
duty, forward the residue from that John Thomas Green executors
of this my last will & testament, hereby, certifying all, — — — — —
written by me made, in the presence of James Green to set my
hand & seal the 22^d day of October A.D. 1818
Signed sealed published & declared by the above named
James Dringle to be his last will in the presence
of his wife James Green to subscribe his name
as his witness in the presence of the Testator.
