8^o In the Name of God Amens. I James Clark of the County of
Rockingham & State of N^e Carolina, being in a sick & low
condition, but of perfect sound mind & memory, thanks to God
for the same; Do this 1st Day of June in the Year of our Lord 1805
Do make publish & declare this my last will & Testament in
manner & form following Viz -

1^o I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Lucy Clark the full
use of the one third my plantation on which I live with my
dwelling house & out houses her natural life & no longer I.
also give unto my wife Lucy two scattres beds with all their
beddinge also two under beds & one bedsted, I also give
unto my wife Lucy my black, silly four years old with her
Sidle Saddle & Bridle. I also give unto my wife Lucy my hole
Cows & her choice of another out of my Stock -

2^o I give & bequeath unto my son James Clark all the two thirds
of my plantation, together with the other third left to my
wife at her death to be his own. I further allow my plantation
Negroes, Stock & Farming Utensils to remain as they now are & to be
under the immediate direction of my friend John Allen Germany
& said John to have cash yearly the same divide of the crops
now has as a just compensation for his labour & my slaves
I desire to support my wife Lucy & family all to remain
as they now are, for the term of three years

I also give & bequeath unto my wife Lucy the use of my
 Negro man Slaves during her natural life & no longer than
 to be the property of my son James, however further allows
 my wife Lucy the use & service of my Negro woman Buggie
 natural life & then to be the property of my son James
 I also give & bequeath unto my son James my remaining
 eight Negroes named Sambo, Joe, Nancy, Billy, Solomon
 Stephen, Julius, Polly, and do hereby empower my Executor
 at the Expiration of the above named three years to either
 sell said Negroes as the law directs or work them on
 my plantation for the use of my son James Clark as
 they may think most proper, I also allow my Executor
 at the full end of the above mentioned three years to
 make sale of all my Stock at publick Venders & the
 money received for them to be paid to Interest, which money
 received for said Stock I give & bequeath unto my son
 James Clark, I give & bequeath unto my wife Lucy my
 Walnut Chest of Drawers, and I also give & devise
 unto my wife Lucy our Walnut Table together with
 all my other furniture, I further allow all my just
 & lawful debts to be paid out of my money owing to me
 & the remainder of said money I give & bequeath unto
 my son James, I also allow my wagon for the use of
 my wife Lucy & family on the plantation for the full term
 of the above mentioned three years & then with the remain
 der & remainder of my little Real & personal to be sold
 as this will directs. And I do by these presents make
 make void & disannul all former wills or Testaments
 by me made or published. And doth hereby appoint
 my Trusty friend Matthew Wallace my legal Executor to
 execute this my last will & Testament, in witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 1st
 day of June 1807 —

natural life & then to be the property of my son James
I also give & bequeath unto my son James my remaining
Eight Negroes named Sambo, Joe, Nancy, Billy, Solomon
Stepney, Julius, Dolly. And do hereby empower my Executor
at the Expiration of the above named three years to either
sell said Negroes as the law directs or work them on
my plantation for the use of my son James Clark as
they may think most proper. I also empower my Executor
at the full end of the above mentioned three years to
make sale of all my Stock at publick vendue & the
Money Received for them to be paid to Interest, which Money
Received for said Stock I give & bequeath unto my son
James Clark. I give & bequeath unto my wife Lucy my
Walnut Chest of Drawers, but I also give & desire
unto my wife Lucy our Walnut Table together with
all my other furniture; I further allow all my just
& lawful debts to be paid out of my money owing to me
& the remainder of said Money I give & bequeath unto
my son James; I also allow my Waggon for the use of
my wife Lucy & family on the plantation for the full term
of the above mentioned three years & then with the remain-
der & remainder of my Estate Real & personal to be sold
as this will directs. And I do by these presents make
make void & disannul all former wills or Testaments
by me made or published. And doth hereby appoint
my Trusty friend Matthew Wallace my legal Executor to
execute this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 10.
day of June 1827 -
